Please join ICAA Rocky Mountain Chapter for a tour of another outstanding Denver Landmark, St. Andrew's Episcopal Church, located at 2015 Glenarm Place, Denver.

St. Andrew's Episcopal Church, originally known as Trinity Memorial Church is a Gothic style church built in 1909 in Denver, and is the only known Colorado work by the great American architect Ralph Adams Cram. The 1928 parish house was designed by the renowned Denver architect Jules Jacques Benedict. The church was listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1975. Expanded in 2008 to a design in keeping with Cram's original plans for a larger church, St. Andrew's now seats 175 in a sanctuary that includes works by Denver artists Marion Buchan and Albert Byron Olson.
