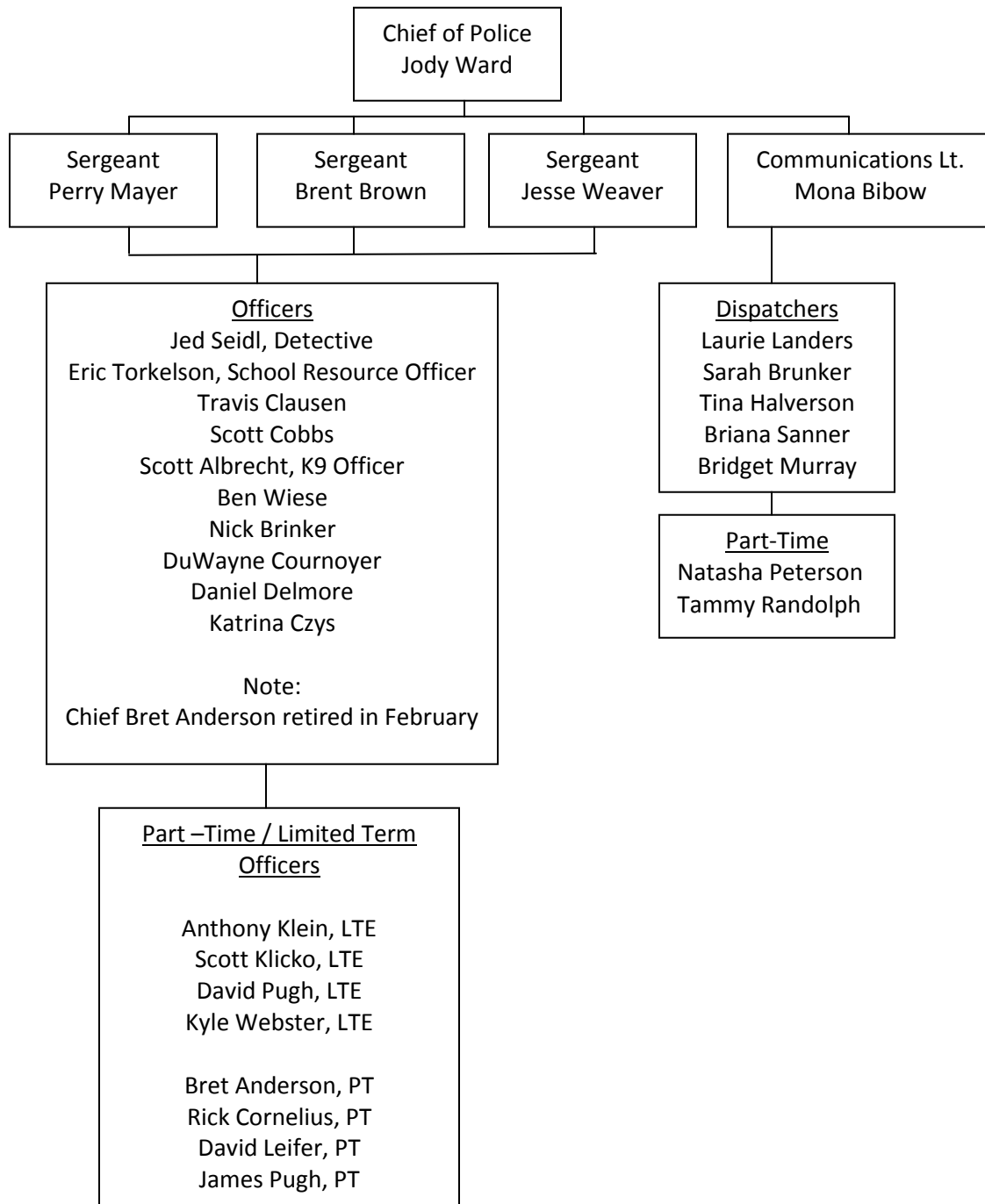

Uniform Crime Statistics

As mandated by the Wisconsin Legislature [§16.964(1)(g)], the Wisconsin Office of Justice Assistance (OJA) is responsible for reporting information concerning the number and nature of criminal offenses known to have been committed in the state. This includes collecting crime and arrest data from 399 separate law enforcement agencies for the FBI's Uniform Crime Reporting Program (a nationwide cooperative statistical effort of more than 17,000 law enforcement agencies voluntarily reporting data on crime). The primary objective of UCR is to generate reliable information for use in law enforcement administration, operation, and management. Today, the American public looks to the Uniform Crime Reports for information on fluctuations in the level of crime, and criminologists, sociologists, legislators, municipal planners, the media, and other students of criminal justice use the statistics for varied research and planning purposes.

This report, prepared by the OJA Statistical Analysis Center (SAC), is a collection of crime data reported to Wisconsin law enforcement agencies in 2010. It contains detailed information on crime volume, rates, and trends on eight major criminal offenses as designated by the FBI: Murder, Forcible Rape, Robbery, Aggravated Assault, Burglary, Larceny-Theft, Motor Vehicle Theft, and Arson.

Drug Statistics

Submitted by Sgt. Weaver

The Wisconsin Dells Police Department made a total of 110 drug related arrests in the year 2011. Possession of Marijuana and Possession of Drug Paraphernalia were the two highest drug arrest categories for the reporting period. This is consistent with national drug trends. Marijuana is the most readily available controlled substance. Marijuana is cheap and can be found in any open air market place, such as: bars, parking lots, city streets, common-living facilities, as well as in private residences and businesses. Possession of Drug Paraphernalia goes without saying. Most illegal drugs require the use of a device (drug paraphernalia) to ingest the drug, to get desired effects.

There is a disturbingly growing trend across America that shows an increased use of Heroin and/or synthetic opiates, such as: Methadone, Oxycodone and several other controlled Schedule I or II Narcotics. Opiate related overdoses are sharply on the rise throughout the country. Opiates are most commonly used amongst 18-25 year old users. Many trends indicate increased introduction and use in high school aged students across the country. Wisconsin Dells is fortunate that this trend has not been seen in the Wisconsin Dells High School. The officers of the Wisconsin Dells Police Department are highly trained in drug investigations and are aware of trends and how the trends impact not only large cities but small communities, such as Wisconsin Dells.

2011 Total Training Hours: 1311

Average Training Hours Per Officer: 93.6

In 2011, The Wisconsin Dells Police Department continued to be one of the best trained agencies in the State of Wisconsin. WDPD Officers compiled a total of **1311 hours of training** for the year which equals to be approximately 93.6 hours of training per officer. This exceeds the Department of Justice standards of a minimum of 24 hours of continuing education. These trainings include classroom, web based training, and also hands on training. Some of the specialized trainings that officers attended include: Vehicular Homicide Investigations, Child Abuse Investigations, Carrying of Concealed Weapons, and Evidence Technician to list a few. Every year officers are also required to attend a 16 hour county wide in-service training. This year officers were trained on Legal Update, Forensic Evidence Collection, Digital Evidence, Death Investigation, and Mental Health Investigations.

The Wisconsin Dells Police Department attempts to keep most training in-house to avoid costly over-time. Below is a list of Officers who are certified to teach specific unified tactics.

2011 Grants

COPS Hiring Recovery Program

In 2009 then Assistant Chief Ward completed and submitted a grant application for a COPS Hiring Recovery Program (CHRP). July 28, 2009 the Wisconsin Dells Police Department was notified by the Department of Justice that the Wisconsin Dells Police Department was awarded funds to employ one full time officer for three years. Part of the agreement was to fund the grant officer one additional year. Wisconsin Dells was one of seven agencies in Wisconsin to receive this funding. The total amount funded with this grant was **\$263,654.00**.

Officer Ben Wiese was hired January 1, 2010. His position will be funded through 2012.



Funded DOT Bureau of Transportation Grants

In Mid 2011 Chief Ward submitted grant application to BOTS. Funding was approved for two grants that run from October 2011 thru September 2012. These funds provided overtime for officers in enforcing mandatory seat-belt laws and speeding. 25% matching funds were required.

Non-Funded DOT Bureau of Transportation Grants

The Wisconsin Dells Police Department continually takes part in BOTS non-funded grants. These grants focus on seat belt usage and OWI Enforcement. Although they are non-funded they provide important statistics to the state, make our community safer and enter us in a \$4,000.00 equipment drawing.

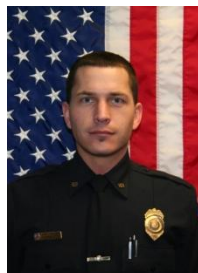

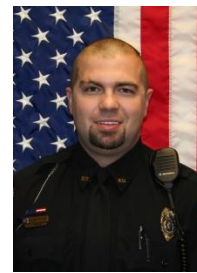

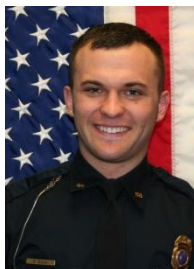
