



t has been great seeing so many people at church these last few months. Could we fill these pews in the summer as well? Bring your friends, and bring your family to worship with us at FPC Mission.





#### 2010-2011 CELEBRATION SUNDAY SERIES A HUGE SUCCESS!



The kids have decided to support World Vision's "Clean Water Fund" with their spring quarter offering.






