DESCRIPTION:

The principal aim of the Target 11 Day at the Rio Conventions Pavilion is to launch the “Partnership for Achieving Aichi Biodiversity Target 11 with Attendant Multiple Benefits”

As only two years remain to achieve the Aichi Biodiversity Targets, this partnership will provide a platform for all partners to express their intent and reiterate their commitments to achieve Aichi Biodiversity Target 11 by 2020, at the global level. The partnership will stimulate regional implementation support networks to align their activities towards the decentralised implementation of focused actions as called for by the Conference of the Parties to the Convention in paragraph 9(d) of Decision XIII/2.

OBJECTIVES:

- 1) To launch the Partnership for Achieving Aichi Biodiversity Target 11 with attendant Multiple Benefits through decentralized implementation of focussed actions;
- 2) To share information on enabling sub-regional implementation support networks for translating paragraph 9(d) of decision XIII/2;
- 3) To showcase synergies between Target 11 actions and other globally agreed goals and targets, and multiple benefits;
- 4) To share information on Other Effective Area-based Conservation Measures (OECMs).
