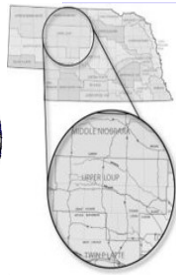

LB 383 to Eliminate State-Aid to Municipalities, counties and Nebraska NRDs

In order to help balance Nebraska’s upcoming biennial budget, difficult and controversial choices must be made this Legislative Session. LB 383, introduced by Senator Cornett, will eliminate state-aid to Municipalities, Counties and Nebraska NRDs. Governor Heinemann approved LB 383 on March 10th. LB 383 will affect the Upper Loup NRD’s (ULNRD) 2011-2012 budget by eliminating just over \$7000 in state-aid.

Budget cuts have not been a stranger to the ULNRD. Fiscal Year 2010 experienced over a \$20,000 reduction in cost share dollars. The ULNRD will strive to maintain current services and cost share programs by continuing to find other funding mechanisms such as grant dollars. Program dollars have been exhausted for 2010-2011, new funds will be available July of 2011. For a list of our cost-share programs please visit our website at

Chemigation Training

The Nebraska Chemigation Act requires irrigators obtain a permit from their local NRD if they intend to apply chemical through an irrigation system after January 1, 1987. The NRDs are responsible for inspecting and permitting the specific safety equipment that must be installed on the irrigation system. To pass inspection the mainline check valve must not have any sort of leak when there is water in the system. This prevents chemical solution from seeping back down the wee and into the groundwater.

An application must be filed for each well site which will apply chemicals through the system. The applicator must be a certified chemigator a permit can be issued.

To obtain a Chemigation permit:

- ◆ Attend UN Extension Service training class and pass a written exam to receive Chemigation Certification (certification is valid for four years). For more information contact Bethany Johnston at the Central Sandhills Extension office or call 308-645-2267.
- ◆ Apply at the Upper Loup Natural Resources District or fill out form on-line form www.upperloupnrd.org under Applications and Forms.
- ◆ Initial application cost for a one year permit is \$30.00. Renewal cost is \$10.00 per year.
- ◆ Deadline for renewal application is June 1.

Recycling grant

The Upper Loup NRD (ULNRD) has been preliminarily approved the 2nd year of a 3 year Environmental Trust recycling grant. To Promote conservation, water quality and waste reduction within the District, the ULNRD had requested funds to help expand current recycling efforts across the District. In 2011, two trailers will be purchased and placed in the communities of Dunning and Mullen. Just recently the ULNRD acquired an additional recycling trailer thanks to the Thedford FCCLA group. This trailer was placed in Seneca. Personal collection bins are also available at the ULNRD office. Limit is one per household. To date 29,800 lbs of recyclable material and 21,600 lbs of cardboard have been collected and taken to the end market, which is 12% of the 3 year goal of 203 tons.

Boater Safety

The Upper Loup NRD in Thedford will host a boating safety test-out session Thursday May 26, 2011. Registration due date is May 16th. Scott Eveland, Boating Safety Officer for the Nebraska Game and Parks commission, will be the instructor for the class.

The Nebraska Boater Safety course is required of all power operators under the age of 18 (including operators of personal watercraft—Jet ski, SeaDoo, Waverunner, etc.) The minimum age to operate a boat is 14. The class covers everything from equipment requirements to safe boat operation, accident prevention and is a great course for both new and experienced boaters. Boat owners who complete the class may qualify for insurance discounts.

Parents are encouraged to attend with their children and boaters of all ages are welcome. The test-out session will run from 10:00 am CT until 12:00 pm CT on Thursday May 26th. The class will be held at the Upper Loup NRD office in Thedford. ACE is for middle school students who have completed sixth, seventh and eighth grades in the 2010-2011 school year and who are interested in having fun and learning about Nebraska Natural Resources. ACE is hosted at the State 4-H Youth Camp near Halsey, June

5th-8th. ACE is sponsored and organized by Nebraska Natural Resources Districts (NRDs) and the Nebraska Association of Resources Districts (NARD).

The four day adventure camp focuses on water quality, soils, range, forestry, and wildlife while educating campers through hands-on activities on the importance of protecting our natural resources. During ACE, campers have the opportunity to roll up their sleeves and dig into nature and form a new understanding of the environment through interactive participation.

In addition, campers have the chance to experience nature through activities such as canoeing, archery, zip line, water rockets, the water slide and other adventures. Campers will also learn about possible careers in the area of natural resources from the professionals who work there every day. This is a great opportunity to get our youth involved in learning about natural resources through hands-on activities with experts that are excited about natural resources.

WATER USE REPORTS NEEDED

Recently the ULNRD sent out water use reports, which are slowly being returned. We are urging irrigators to complete and return their forms at their earliest convenience. Irrigators may also call in their water use.

Water use reporting is essential to the management of our vital resource. Annual reporting of water use is important to protect stakeholder interests, adopting actions in times of water emergencies, and providing data for effective farm management. To protect the farmer's in any litigation related to the state's right to water use in a given basin, existing uses must be able to be quantified. Knowing water use also allows a wider range of options for dealing with any future drought-related water emergencies.
