## • 2013-14 Carving Classes (Tuesday Night Carving)

The goal of our Tuesday Night Carving Classes is to provide a setting for beginning carvers to learn basic carving skills and provide opportunities for intermediate and advanced carvers to continue their learning.

Place: Amiskwaciy Academy (101 Airport Road – The old City Center Airport Terminal)

**Dates:** October 1, 2013 to May 5, 2014(all classes are full year)

**Time:** 6:00pm – 9:00 pm

**Cost:** All classes are at a cost of \$300 plus a shop fee of \$30.

 In order to encourage new carvers, our beginner class (Beginner Loon) will be offered for the full year at a cost of \$175 for new carvers which includes AWCA membership and shop fee. Non-beginner carvers taking this class will be charged the full \$300 plus the shop fee and will be responsible for their own AWCA membership fee.

 Junior carvers under the age of 15 will be provided free classes but must be accompanied by an adult.

- \$1000.00 for the best life-size Songbird, M/F decorative or slick with suitable habitat.
- \$750.00 for the best North American Land Mammal, decorative or slick with suitable habitat.
- \$500 for the best North American Shorebird, decorative or slick (gunning style on a stick acceptable)
- o All entries must be wildlife, no carvings of domesticated animals.
