A new 4-H group is forming: Friends of 4-H Platte County. This group was designed to establish a means for 4-H alumni, friends, parents, businesses and community leaders to nurture and support University of Missouri Extension 4-H Youth Programs and leadership development activities in Platte County, Missouri, through their volunteered time, talents, and treasure.

"Having been involved on the Mizzou Alumni Association governing board, I have seen how chapters ebb and flow in their size, activity and member involvement. In addition to his involvement in the KC Chapter, Newham has served as a member of the University of Missouri Alumni Association Governing Board, Agriculture Journalism Task Force, Agriculture Education Program Development Committee and has served as president of the College of Agriculture Alumni Association. He is also active in a number of agricultural industry associations, including the American Business Media Agri-Council, the Livestock Publications Council, and the National Agri-Marketing Association. Newham and his wife, Peggy, live in Leawood, Ks. He has one daughter, Jordan, and a step-son, Matt.

"One of the really exciting things during the past 3-4 years is the influx of new, young board members and volunteers" said Newham. "That is a testament to great leadership during that period. I just hope I can be a part of maintaining that tradition."

Member Spotlight – Jackie Clark, Incoming MAA National President



To call Jackie Clark a 4'10" fiery gal with a love for Mizzou football, politics, gardening and sporting clays would be an understatement of who she is and what she's done for Mizzou. Meet the new incoming president of the Mizzou Alumni Association!

Clark, BA'84, is a native of Blue Springs, MO. "I've been a Tiger since the sixth grade," she adds, having attended Lee's Summit elementary, junior high and high schools with tiger mascots before heading off to Mizzou.

Her college days were filled with student government activities. She started her involvement as a freshman Missouri

Students Association senator and was selected to be an intern for the Associated Students of the University of Missouri (ASUM) her sophomore year, the first year that sophomores were selected for this honor. And, as part of this distinguished group of students, Clark had the opportunity to lobby on behalf of the University in Jefferson City and Washington D.C. Her role within the organization grew when she was elected to the ASUM Board of Directors the next year, and then Chairman of the Board her senior year. Clark's dedication to Mizzou did not go unnoticed. During her junior year, she was tapped in to Omicron Delta Kappa honor society and went on to serve as president of that organization.

"Internships like ASUM and others at Mizzou give students the real-world experience that they need to succeed in their career," she said. "That internship was the foundation of my career."

Clark began her involvement in the Kansas City Chapter of MAA in the early 90s and became one of the co-founders of the Black and Gold Tiger Ball. Her love of all things legislative led her get involved with the Mizzou Legislative Network and paved the way for her leadership within the national MAA organization.

When she's not cheering on the Tigers, Clark is the Director of Communications and Public Affairs for the Ash Grove Cement Company in Overland Park, where she directs Ash Grove's public and government affairs as well as its corporate communications, political action, community relations and crisis management programs. She's a lifelong Chiefs and Royals fan who also enjoys traveling, tending to her garden, taking classes at the Kansas City Culinary Center, and shopping for tiger-striped attire. And along the way, she's picked up a new hobby...shooting her .20 gauge shotgun in sporting clay competitions! Clark is excited to begin her tenure as national President. "I want to see the Innovation Park (in Blue Springs) come to fruition," Clark says. "It will establish a Mizzou footprint in Kansas City where residents, students and alumni can convene."

"I also want Big 12 championships for all of our sports teams and some NCAA championship trophies," she laughs. We're pulling for you, Jackie!
