Local Mizzou Graduates Empower Young Women of Uganda through Handcrafted Product Design

Sseko Designs is a not-just-for-profit enterprise that recognizes the power of business and responsible consumerism to support sustainable economic development, which in turn affects a country's educational, justice and health care systems. The goal of Sseko Designs is two-fold: provide university tuition for these promising young women through a sustainable monthly income, while also contributing to the overall economic development of Uganda.

The company, created by Ben and Liz Bohannon, exists in large part because of the vision, hope, and challenge that some of their peers had for a different way to look at our relationship to Africa, and to economic development. Sseko is a tiny part of creating a sustainable future for a small group of Ugandan woman. What is yet to be determined is what these girls will do with the future that is now afforded them.

The Ugandan school system is designed with a nine month gap between secondary school and university. These nine months are intended to allow time for students to earn money for tuition before continuing on to university. However, in an impoverished and male dominated society, many of these young women struggle to find fair work during this time. Sseko Designs hires recent secondary school graduates for this nine month period to live and work together, while earning money that will go directly towards their university education.

What can you look forwarded to purchasing from Sseko designs?

Handcrafted sandals with interchangeable ribbons for a wrap around your ankle tie! Various options are offered as well as coordinating footwear for bridal parties. Ben and Liz Bohannon call Kansas City home and within two years following graduation from Mizzou started Sseko. MU-KU baseball at Kauffman Stadium

The Border War is rounding the bases again in Kansas City.

This year's annual MU-KU baseball game is scheduled for **April 21 at Kauffman Stadium** – the home of the Kansas City Royals. **First pitch is set for 6:30 pm and the turnstile gates will open at 5:00 pm**

The non-conference game is in addition to the three-game regular Big 12 series between the rivals on May 7-9 at Lawrence, Kansas.

This will be the fourth meeting for the two teams at The K, but only the third game played. The first scheduled MU-KU game at Kauffman Stadium was rained out in 2007. The Jayhawks holds a 2-0 advantage in the series at The K after last year's 7-3 victory over the Tigers. 11th Annual Tiger Ball slated for April 23

Tiger Ball is an annual gala and auction held in Kansas City that benefits the Mizzou Alumni Association - Kansas City Chapter's Alumni Scholars Program and the Tiger Scholarship Fund.

The Alumni Scholars Program awards more than \$50,000 annually in scholarships to MU students from the greater Kansas City area. The Tiger Scholarship Fund provides funding for the University's athletic department to continue recruiting athletes with academic prowess. In 2008, Mizzou boasted the highest graduation rate and GPA of all schools in the Big 12.

"Since its inception in 2000, Tiger Ball has raised more than \$430,000 for Mizzou student scholarships. Last year alone, the ball raised over \$40,000 in scholarship funds, says Emily Crafton, co-director of the 2010 event.

This year's event will be held on Friday, April 23 at the Hyatt hotel in downtown Kansas City. "We are excited to announce our three honorary cochairs- Melinda Petet, Chase Coffman and Martin Rucker," Crafton states. Petet is the Director of Tiffany & Co. on the Country Club Plaza. She has been a generous supporter of Tiger Ball and Mizzou events in her role at Tiffany & Co. while Coffman and Rucker were both standout tight ends on Mizzou's championship football teams. Coffman, a native of Peculiar, MO, now plays for the Cincinnati Bengals, while Rucker, a native of St. Joseph, MO, suits up for the Philadelphia Eagles.

Mizzou Beats KU in Harvester's Food Drive

To all the Mizzou Alumni, Tiger Club Members, and Mizzou Football Fans who
