1976 1st State Workshop. Hosted by the University of Dayton.

The tradition begins at Dayton....

The first Ohio Intramural Sports State Workshop was held in May of 1976 at the University of Dayton, Physical Activities Center, and was hosted by the NIRSA State Director, Patti Holmes, Billy Mayo, UD Director welcomed approximately 25 participants. Dr. Jim Peterson, US Military Academy and NIRSA Regional Vice-President, gave the keynote address. The one day program was highlighted by a tour of UD's Physical Activities Center and a commitment to begin a tradition of annual state workshops was agreed upon by all that attended. The conference program was very general in nature and consisted primarily of a variety of buzz sessions. Approximately 12 schools from Ohio were represented.

1977 2nd Annual State Workshop. Hosted by Miami University.

Miami University was the site of the second annual "Intramural and Recreational Sports Activities Workshop." Hosted by Sally Myers, the workshop was held on May 13, 1977 in Millett Hall. Dr. Robert Ethridge, Miami's Vice President for Student Affairs, greeted over 55 participants from more than seven states. Art Swanson, NIRSA Vice President and Director of LSU, gave the keynote address. Highlights of the conference included presentations by: Dr. Larry Preo, Marquette University on "Faculty, Staff, Alumni and Family Programming"; Mr. Rich Mull, Indiana University, "Recreational Sports- What is it?" and Central Michigan University's staff "Floor Hockey Demonstration." An evening steak cookout followed the day's activities. State Director: Patti Holmes, Region III Vice President: Lynn Heyliger.

1978 3rd Annual Workshop. Hosted by Ohio State University.

OSU's "Intramural Interaction"....

Ohio State University was the site of the third annual state workshop entitled, "Intramural Interaction." Hosted by Dr. Bruce Maurer over 50 participants enjoyed a walking tour of the \$10 million dollar OSU Recreational-Intramural Sports Facility. All were welcomed by Fred Beekman, OSU Director, and Dr. Richard Armitage, VP for Student Services. Dr. Peter Graham, Vice President for NIRSA, delivered the keynote address. Other program highlights included Dr. George Haniford, Purdue, speaking on "Contemporary Program Philosophies"; "Facility Management" by Dr. Mary Daniels and Dave Griner,

OSU Staff, and Rich Mull, Indiana University, speaking on "Participants Rights." State Director: Sally Myers, Region III Vice President: Bruce Anderson.

1979 4th Annual Workshop. Hosted by Bowling Green State University.

Bowling Green's new Rec Center is introduced....

Dr. Ben McQuire, past president of NIRSA and Sally Myers, Miami University, and Ellen Gould, University of Michigan, coordinated the fourth annual state workshop on May 3-4, 1979. Encouraging participants from both Ohio and Michigan, over 65 participants attended the conference at Bowling Green State University. Dr. Larry Preo, President of NIRSA, keynoted the workshop with his presentation entitled, "The Future is Ours." The theme, "New Directions in Recreational Sports," was explored by Dr. Jim Peterson, US Military Academy, in his presentation on "Physical Abilities of Women as they relate to Women's Programming." Dr. Richard Eakin, Bowling Green's Vice Provost, presented a brief historical background of the development of the \$9.3 million dollar BGSU Student Recreation Center. Participants were treated to a tour of the outstanding facility, a western style steak cook-out concluded the day's activities. A t-shirt souvenir was provided by Miami University to commemorate the event. NIRSA State Director: Sally Myers, NIRSA Region III Vice President: Bruce Anderson.

1980 5th Workshop Kent State University

Student Leadership at Kent State University....

Dr. Steve Sherman, Recreation Director of Brooklyn College and Region III Vice President of NIRSA, kicked off the fifth annual state workshop at Kent State University. Hosted by Winona Vannoy, close to 60 participants concentrated their thoughts and ideas on the theme: "Student Leadership in Recreational Activities." The workshop, held on May 15-16, 1980, was expanded to a one and a half day program. Steve Kintigh, NIRSA State Director proposed an Ohio Recreational Sports Association. Two program highlights included individuals participating in a wheelchair basketball game and a tour of Kent State University. The workshop hosts provided participants with a t-shirt memento celebrating the 5th annual conference.

1981 6th Ohio Recreational Sports Workshop/Conference-Hosted by Youngstown State University

Ohio Recreational Sports Association born....

Tim Miller, Director of Youngstown State University Recreation Department, served as conference host of the sixth annual state workshop on March 12-13, 1981. Region III Vice President Patti Holmes gave the keynote address focusing her thoughts on "A Positive Mental Attitude." "Problem Solving" was the workshop theme and several outstanding YSU professors gave mini-workshops on variations of the theme. Two presentations were offered every hour. New topics that surfaced for the first time included wellness programming, all-nighters, and equipment care. The **Ohio Recreational Sports Association** was formed under the leadership Steve Kintigh, Tim Miller, Sally Meyers and Ken Kaiser. Steve Kintigh becomes first ORSA President, Tim Miller becomes Vice President.

1981 7th Ohio Recreational Sports Workshop/Conference hosted by the University of Dayton ***Back to Dayton: Mid-East Regional Workshop....***

NIRSA State Director / ORSA President, Steve Kintigh, proposed a Mid-East Recreational Sports Workshop to include the Tri-State Area. The seventh annual state workshop was held November 19-20, 1981, at the Dayton Holidome. This workshop was one of the most successful workshops with over seventy participants. Mr. Tom Fericks, University of Dayton Vice President for University Relations, welcomed all participants and was followed by Dr. Ed Hammond, University of Louisville, who gave an excellent presentation on time management and conflict resolution. An inspirational talk by George Haniford, Purdue University, entitled, "The Good Old Days Now," closed the workshop on

a very positive note. Musco Lighting sponsored a social for all who attended. The NIRSA Region III Vice President was Patti Holmes.

1982 8th Ohio Recreational Sports Workshop/Conference hosted by Hocking Technical College and Ohio University.

Hocking Tech and Ohio University combine efforts....

Co-hosted by Hocking Technical College and Ohio University, the eighth annual Workshop took place on Hocking Tech's campus at the school's hotel on October 21-22, 1982. Mark Wileman, Director at Hocking Tech and Dick Woolison, Director at Ohio University, provided a workshop program for approximately fifty participants. Autumn tours of the Hocking Valley in Nelsonville, Ohio and Ohio University's recreational facilities were well received by the group. The staff at Bowling Green reminisced about their Karen Willard, a Graduate Assistant at Miami. Outdoor recreation programming was featured. The workshop was unique for two reasons: 1.) it was held in a Hocking Tech learning facility and 2.) it was the first time a technical college in Ohio hosted the workshop. State Director/ORSA President: Steve Kintigh; NIRSA Region III Vice President: Mary Daniels.

1983 9th Ohio Recreational Sports Workshop/Conference hosted by Wittenberg University. Tours of the new Recreation Complex are highlighted.

Dr. Tom Jones opened the ninth annual state workshop at Wittenberg University with a presentation on management styles, "Efficiently vs. Effectiveness." Tim Miller, newly appointed Recreation Director, hosted the conference, which was held November 3-4, 1983. Testing for the NIRSA Recreational Sports Specialist Certification was held at the state workshop for the first time. Greg Jordan, NIRSA State Director/ORSA President, laid the groundwork for plans for the tenth annual state workshop and encouraged everyone to make efforts to contact those in the state who had not attended before to be a part of this historical workshop. Other presentations included a video of the National Flag Football Tournament, discussions on women's participation, and a film on an interesting and very different type of competition: the "Paul Bunyan Program" at Hocking Tech. NIRSA Region III Vice President: Dr. Mary Daniels.

1984 10th Ohio Recreational Sports Workshop/Conference hosted by the University of Toledo. A perfect 10 at University of Toledo....

Pat Besner, Director at the University of Toledo, hosted the tenth annual state workshop on November 1-2, 1984 at the University of Toledo Continuing Education Center. Highlights included Dr. Larry Preo, Marquette University, on "To Be or Not To Be: Confronting Career Change." Dr. John Drowotzy of the University of Toledo gave a talk on "Legal Concerns with Facilities and Participants." The ORSA members decided to continue affiliation with NIRSA. A fun night of entertainment included shopping at Portside and a social at the Red Roof Inn. NIRSA State Director/ORSA President: Tim Miller, NIRSA Region III Vice President Tony Clements.

1985 11th Ohio Recreational Sports Workshop/Conference hosted by Miami University. The tradition continues at Miami....

The eleventh annual state workshop was held at Miami University on October 23-24, 1985 at the Marcum Conference Center. It was hosted by Patti Holmes. This year's theme, "Keys to Professional Success" was appropriately demonstrated throughout the workshop as a diversified mixture of recreational sports professionals lectured, debated, and shared ideas on topics that provided insight into the recreational sports profession. Entertainment was provided by the Indiana Thump-Jumpers who performed amazing routines with jump ropes. The Ohio Recreational Sports Association becomes the first NIRSA recognized State Association under the direction of NIRSA State Director/ORSA President: Tim Miller. NIRSA Region III Vice President: Tony Clements.

1986 12th Annual Ohio Recreational Sports Workshop/Conference hosted by Lorain County Community College.

LCCC and Oberlin open their doors....

Jeff White, Director of Recreation at Oberlin College and Greg Sferra, Director of Recreation at Lorain County Community College put together a most interesting and entertaining state workshop. It was held November 6-7, 1986. An exciting session dealing with risk management was provided by Dr. Betty Van Der Smissen, Bowling Green State University. Other highlights included tours of Oberlin College and LCCC, Team Walleyball competition, individual racquetball tournament and a swap shop where participants traded t-shirts and other reward paraphernalia. The evening entertainment included a night at the races. NIRSA State Director/ORSA President: Tim Miller; Region III Vice President: Tony Clements.

1987 13th Annual Ohio Recreational Sports Workshop/Conference hosted by Baldwin Wallace College. A New Recreation Center is opened.

Tim Miller and his staff at Baldwin Wallace College put together a strong state workshop on November 5-6, 1987. NIRSA President-Elect, Tony Clements was the keynote speaker and delivered a humorous but sincere message dealing with our commitment to excellence. Other topics included motivating your staff, Rec Sports and Law, and computerized ID systems. Baldwin Wallace College gave tour of their new Recreation Center. Participants went on a tour of the Cleveland Browns Practice Facilities and also took part in a Hawaiian Beach Party at the Harley Hotel indoor pool. 1988 14th Annual Bowling Green State University ORSA Workshop XIV....

The keynote delivered by speaker Ray Tucker was, "How Do You Motivate People". Patti Holmes spoke on "Enhancing Performance in the Workplace."
