Twenty sixth annual Fall Festival will be Thursday, September 27 at 6:00 at Holiday Inn Express in Pullman. Please note change in location. Our guest speaker this year is Ann Shaw who is teaching the Ruth McDowell method of piecing pictorial quilts. Ann is a designer in her own right and is teaching nationally. Dinner tickets are \$32 and are available by mid-June at Stitches and Petals. Friday workshop is Flowers of the Gorge; choose from a poppy, iris, sunflower or trillium. Saturday's workshop is Chicken Challenge with choice of Gallus Gallus, Barnyard Queen, Quack, Ruddy Rooster or Curious Duck. Workshops are \$55 which includes lunch. Pattern purchase will be required and not included in fee. Please let Celia know which pattern you want when you sign up. Classes will be held at Palouse Community Center from 9-4. Workshops will stress choosing fabrics for your design, so sewing machines aren't required.
