This will be our third itineration since we have become missionaries with Assemblies of God World Missions (AGWM).

This budget consists of both our salary for living but also all of the expenses necessary to minister.

We are in continual need of prayer warriors lifting up the souls of the Japanese people before the throne of God. We are also in need of your prayers for our family's safety, health and growth. We will be leaving our Japanese church in Tokyo a bit in the lurch so it is vital that we return to Japan ASAP! Please pray that the Lord's will is accomplished during this season of itineration.

So, Why is Itineration Important?

I am sure that some of you reading this newsletter are either, 1: unaware of what itineration is or 2: question whether it is relevant or effective. I feel that it would be appropriate to take a moment and share how truly important and valuable missionary itineration is to our churches and to the people "in the pews". To clearly express my thoughts I would like to use three "missions keywords". They are **Go, Give & Serve**.

Go Both Kathryn and I were called to missions in our teens. The reason for this is that ever since we were children we heard various missionaries, itinerating through our churches, telling us of the great things that God was doing around the world. People are made acutely aware of God's work in this world when listening to a missionary standing in front of you.

Not only did we hear what God was doing through other people's ministries, but we were also encouraged by the missionary to seek the Lord and see what He desired to do in our own lives! <u>I firmly believe that a missionary's most</u> vital role within the local church is to open people's eyes and ears to the fact that God has a plan for their life and <u>ministry.</u>

In our last itineration alone, we inspired two different couples, neither of whom we had a previous relationship with, to seek God's will for their lives. Both of those couples are currently preparing for their first term as missionaries!

Give I am a pastor. I clearly understand the delicate balance between giving and the operation of a local church. And because of that fact I know that healthy missions

giving is always preceded by an appropriate understanding of Biblical principles regarding tithing and giving to the local church. It is through giving to missions those principles are bolstered and the faithful giving to the church increases. If this does not occur then something is wrong. Experiencing God's faithfulness and blessing through giving to the church encourages giving to missions and visa versa.

As a pastors and missionaries, Kathryn and I never encourage people to put missions giving before tithes and offerings to the local church. God cannot bless that kind of backward giving mentality.

Serve I am sure that some of you fear "losing" church members to the missions field; this is an unfortunate and misguided attitude. As I mentioned before, Kathryn and I were called in our teens and it was for that very reason that we became so involved in our church. We cut our teeth by learning to minister within the local church in America. It was clear to us that we could never be used to evangelize or minister in a foreign land if we could not do so first in our home country.

To this day our most influential mentor has been the senior pastor of our home church. The youth leaders that we worked with had an immense role in shaping our spiritual outlook on life. By serving we helped to raise up those around us to be new leaders within the church. And through it all we were examples to both those young and older than us. It is amazing how many people in their later years can be encouraged by young people who are on fire for the Lord and serving in the church.

Itineration takes time and money but it is an invaluable part of the growth of our local churches. I hope you agree!

We are blessed to be able to go to the Philippines in March and participate in a Asia Pacific regional "Spend Yourself" meeting.
