Marjorie S. Camp. Margie is the Administration Director and directs the TrebleMakers and Cantus for Young Voices of Colorado, a premier children's choir in south metro Denver. She is on the music education faculty at Metropolitan State College of Denver, where she teaches the music methods classes and supervises student teachers.

Mrs. Camp taught public school music for 30 years and retired from the Cherry Creek School District in 2004 after spending 15 years as choir director at Campus Middle School. Choirs from Campus Middle School performed at many CMEA Clinic/Conferences and the Eighth Grade Treble Choir performed at the 1996 SWACDA Convention. Mrs. Camp also served the Cherry Creek School District as the music coordinator.

Margie is the immediate past president of the Southwestern Division of the American Choral Directors Association. Mrs. Camp served as SWACDA Treasurer for ten years and was program chair for the Kansas City and Denver Conferences. She has served Colorado ACDA as President, Secretary and co-editor of the Colorado Conductor.

She has served in multiple leadership roles for Colorado Music Educators Association and is currently the Publications Manager. Margie enjoys being a regular clinician for the annual conference as well as serving as a mentor to many new choir directors in Colorado.

Margie has served as clinician, adjudicator and director for workshops, contests and honor choirs throughout the United States. Prior to coming to Colorado, Margie taught in San Antonio. While in Texas, she served the Texas Choral Director's Association as Secretary/Treasurer and the Texas Music Educator's Association in many leadership capacities. Mrs. Camp received her Bachelor of Music Degree from Trinity University, her Master of Music from the University of Texas at San Antonio, and her Specialist in Education from the University of Colorado at Denver.

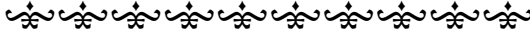

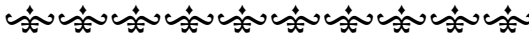

She assists with the other choirs in that vibrant program.

She earned her BME from Wichita State University and her Masters' degree at University of Missouri-Kansas City. Additional trainings and certifications have been completed through CME, Baker University, Emporia State University and MidAmerica Nazarene University.

Professionally, Mrs. Harrison has served in clinician, presenter or conductor capacities in Tennessee, Texas, Arkansas, Kansas, Nebraska, Illinois and Missouri. She has been nominated for Who's Who Among American Teachers three times, has served as the middle level choral chairperson for the Northeast District of Kansas Music Educators Association, has been selected as a building-level Master Teacher twice (1998, 2005), and was chosen as KMEA NE-District Outstanding Middle Level Choral Music Educator in 2003 and 2009. After completing a 2-year term as the American Choral Directors Association Kansas Chairperson for Repertoire and Standards for Junior High and Middle School Choral Music, Gretchen has served as the current National Chairperson for ACDA Junior High and Middle School Repertoire and Standards since 2009.

Personally, Mrs. Harrison is married to a busy high school band director and is the mom of a music education-degree seeking college sophomore at Kansas State, and a music technology-degree seeking college freshman at Fort Hays State University.

Allen Hightower is a professor of music and conductor of the renowned Nordic Choir. He serves as director of choral activities, giving leadership to a choral program that includes four choral conductors, six choirs, and over 500 singers.

Prior to joining the faculty at Luther, Dr. Hightower served as professor of music and director of choral activities at Sam Houston State University in Huntsville, Texas. During his tenure, the SHSU Chorale performed for the 2007 National Convention of the American Choral Directors Association, the 2010 Southwestern Division of ACDA, and the 2003, 2006, and 2010 conventions of the TMEA.

Before joining the faculty at Sam Houston, Allen served on the faculty of California State University, Long Beach, conducting the CSULB Chamber Singers. His high school teaching experience includes teaching at Klein High School in Houston, Texas and at Odessa Permian High School. Under Allen's direction, the Permian High School Kantorei performed for the 1996 TMEA convention.

A life-long church musician, Dr. Hightower has served Baptist, Methodist, Presbyterian, and Congregational churches in Texas and California. For the second time, he will serve as the Duesenberg Concert Choir Chair for Lutheran Summer Music Academy and Festival in the summer of 2011.

From 2005-10 Allen was music director of the Houston Masterworks Chorus, Houston's largest independent chorus. Referring to her debut CD recording, “You Taught My Heart”, legendary jazz bassist Rufus Reid says, “Jennifer integrates rich vocal quality, clarity of pitch and emotion with an additional pivotal skill that sets her apart from other great singers; she sings improvisations that are melodically and rhythmically interesting from the point of view of a jazz instrumentalist.” Jennifer demonstrates tremendous versatility in her ability to not only lead her own small jazz group, but also as a big band vocalist, most notably as the featured vocalist on the Doug Lawrence Orchestra CD, “Big Band Swing”. Jennifer is the alto voice and one of the arranger/composers for two professional vocal groups: Vertical Voices, with Kerry Marsh, Julia Dollison and Greg Jasperse, and Los Angeles-based Sixth Wave. Both groups maintain an active performance and tour schedule in the U.S. and Canada. Jennifer has performed or recorded with such musical legends as Doc Severinsen, Barry Manilow, Cy Coleman, Marilyn & Alan Bergman, Doc Severinsen, as a backup vocalist for Bono on the 2002 Grammy Awards, and on television shows and films including “Live Free or Die Hard”, “Ice Age 2 & 3”, “Wall-E”, “Speed Racer”, “2012”, “Enchanted”, “Star Trek” and “Percy Jackson: The Lightning Thief” and the FOX smash hit, “Glee”. Jennifer has gained notoriety not only for her performing abilities, but also for her commitment to jazz education. She was an active long-time member and advocate of IAJE (International Association of Jazz Educators), now is a member of JEN (Jazz Education Network), and has taught the vocalists at the Jamey Aebersold Summer Jazz Camps since 1998. In addition, she taught privately and directed downBeat [magazine] award-winning Vocal Jazz Ensembles at eight universities, including Western Michigan University, University of Miami (FL), Chicago College of the Performing Arts at Roosevelt University, the University of Southern California, and her current teaching position as Assistant Professor and Director of Vocal Jazz at the University of North Texas.

Carolbeth True has been a very active member of the St. Louis musical community for many years. She is adjunct professor at Webster University—teaching jazz and classical piano, and also maintains an extensive private student roster. For years she has led her own group, The Carolbeth Trio, and now is co-leader, along with her son David True, of the group Two Times True. She is the pianist with Hard Bop Heritage, a modern jazz ensemble led by local trumpet legend Randy Holmes; with the Sessions Big Band; with Wind of the Spirit praise band at her church; and is an original member of the cast of The Jazz Story, a 1-hour overview of jazz history at the Sheldon Concert Hall. Carolbeth has backed many name jazz artists, and performed a number of concertos with various orchestras. In 2005, she was named St. Louis Musician of the year by St. Louis Magazine, and was the 2007 recipient of the Excellence in the Arts Award from the Arts and Education Council of Greater St. Louis. Carolbeth received the Riverfront Times Jazz Musician of the Year award in 2008. She is heard on two trio CDs; New World Harmonica Jazz with Sandy Weltman; two Sessions Big Band CDs as well as I’m All Smiles with vocalist Debby Lennon, and most recently on the 2007 collaboration with her son David True on drums: Two Times True, on the Victoria Records label, as well as on the recently-released CD of saxophone-great Larry Johnson entitled “Circles”.

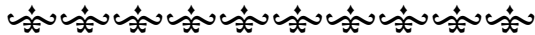

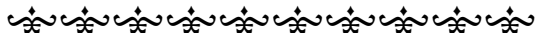

MCDA is a state organization of the American Choral Directors Association. Founded in 1959, the American Choral Directors Association (ACDA) is a nonprofit music-education organization whose central purpose is to promote excellence in choral music through performance, composition, publication, research, and teaching. In addition, ACDA strives through arts advocacy to elevate choral music's position in American society.

ACDA membership consists of approximately 18,000 choral directors who represent more than one million singers across the United States. ACDA members teach choral music in public and private schools - kindergarten through senior high school - and at the college and university levels. They conduct a variety of choral groups, including boychoirs, children's choirs, men's and women's choruses, junior and senior high school choirs, college and university choruses, ethnic choirs, vocal-jazz ensembles, and symphony choruses. They also conduct choirs in their communities and in their places of worship.
