Christy Elsner. A native Kansan, Christy Elsner is the founder and the Artistic Director of the Allegro Choirs of Kansas City. The upbeat premier choir program enriches and transforms the lives of children and youth by learning and performing beautiful music of the highest quality with technical excellence. Since its creation in 2000, the choir program has blossomed from one choir of 38 to over 200 singers in five ensembles. Heralded as “the voice of angels” by the Kansas City Star, Allegro inspires thousands of audience members each year with its varied repertoire and heartfelt singing. The choirs have performed by invitation at conventions for the Southwest American Choral Directors, Kansas Music Educators Association, and Kansas Choral Directors Association. The choirs are frequent guests of the Kansas City Symphony. They have served as choir-in-residence for Queen’s City Festival in Cincinnati, Crescent City Festival in New Orleans, Canterbury Cathedral in England, and for Choral Music Educator workshops. In 2012, Allegro sang in Carnegie Hall in New York and the Meyerson Symphony Hall in Dallas. Allegro has toured extensively in the US and abroad including the 2011 Italy tour with performances in St. Peter’s Basilica. Brio combines song and community service by partnering with Operation Breakthrough to help defeat childhood poverty.

Mrs. Elsner is an active clinician for children’s, youth, and treble choirs and enjoys giving workshops on innovative rehearsing and unusual teaching tools. Mrs. Elsner is honored to conduct the 2012 NWACDA Children’s Honor Choir and the 2012 Wyoming and Missouri All-State Children’s Honor Choirs. In 2011, she shared her choral passion with honor choirs in Arkansas, Kansas, Missouri, Mississippi, and Louisiana. She is the 2010 recipient of the Kindest-Kansas Citian and the 2008 recipient of the MENC Outstanding Middle Level Educator. She is the current SWACDA Children’s and Community Youth R&S Chair. She is a past recipient of the KCDA Outstanding Young Conductor Award. She received her music education degree from the University of Kansas and received the Marcus E. Hahn Award for Outstanding Senior in Music Education. Professional memberships include MENC, Chorister’s Guild, Chorus America, and ACDA. Christy and her husband, Sean, stay busy with their three children: Chandler, Chase, and Carlee.

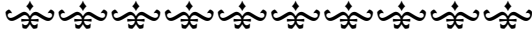

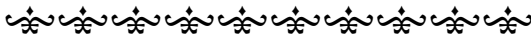

Andrea Ramsey is a Ph.D student in choral music education and University Distinguished Fellowship recipient at Michigan State University where she has assisted with the Women's Chamber Ensemble under the direction of Dr. Sandra Snow and conducted the MSU Chamber Choir. She holds a Bachelor of Arts degree in Music Education from Arkansas Tech University and a Masters of Music in Choral Conducting from the University of Kansas where she served as a graduate teaching assistant and conductor of the KU Men's Glee Club - a traditional collegiate male chorus established in 1890. Additionally, she has served as assistant director and continues to serve as composer-in-residence to the Allegro Community Children's Choir of the Kansas City metro area--an upbeat, energetic youth choral program serving over 190 singers in four ensembles, grades 3-12. She has traveled in residency with Allegro con Brio on tours to Austria and the Czech Republic (2008), and Italy (2011).

A native Arkansan, Andrea has eleven years of teaching experience with children's, public school and university choruses. Her choral program in the Bentonville Public School district in Northwest Arkansas at Washington Junior High School grew to include approximately 375 students in grades 7-8. The choirs were twice invited to perform for the Arkansas All-State Music Conference.

A regularly-commissioned and ASCAP award-winning composer, her works are published with Boosey & Hawkes, Hal Leonard, Colla Voce, Alliance, Santa Barbara, Pavane, Carl Fischer, and BriLee music. Andrea also enjoys work as a guest conductor and presenter.

Jonathan Reed is Professor of Music and Associate Director of Choral Programs at Michigan State University School of Music where he conducts the State Singers, the Men's Glee Club and teaches courses in conducting at both the undergraduate and graduate level. In 1999, the Associated Students of Michigan State University (ASMSU) presented him with the Outstanding Faculty Award. Dr. Reed is also Director of Music at the Peoples Church of East Lansing. He is a contributing author to GIA's The School Choral Program, and is series advisor for Boosey and Hawkes choral series entitled In Low Voice.

Dr. Reed enjoys an active career as a clinician/conductor, conducting festivals and all-state choruses throughout the United States. Recently he has conducted all state choruses in Indiana, Colorado, New Mexico, Virginia, Texas, Oklahoma, Kentucky, Tennessee, Maryland, Louisiana, Wisconsin, Arkansas, Georgia, as well as honor choirs for the Northwest, Western, and Southern Divisions of The American Choral Directors Association. His choirs have performed at divisional and national conferences of ACDA. He has presented interest sessions at two national conferences of ACDA (1999, 2005) and at numerous state ACDA conferences. He has also served ACDA as a state newsletter editor, a state president, and divisional and national chair of the Repertoire and Standards committee on Male Chorus.

Steve Zegree. Internationally recognized as one of the most respected vocal jazz conductors and educators in the world, Steve Zegree is also active as a guest conductor, clinician, arranger, pianist and adjudicator. He serves as “Pam and Jack Burks Professor of Music” at the Jacobs School of Music at Indiana University. His career as a conductor, clinician and pianist includes performances on five continents. A renowned educator, his students are among today’s leaders in jazz and pop performance, Broadway, recording studio production, writing, arranging, singing, and music education.

Formerly the Bobby McFerrin Distinguished Professor of Music at Western Michigan University, his internationally acclaimed vocal jazz ensemble, Gold Company, won nearly fifty prestigious “Down Beat Awards” from Down Beat magazine and performed at MENC and ACDA National Conventions, IAJE International Conferences, the World Symposium on Choral Music, several major jazz festivals, and with recognized artists including Bobby McFerrin, Janis Siegel, Kurt Elling, Paquito D’Rivera, Bob Mintzer, Jon Hendricks, Darmon Meader, Mark Murphy, Don Shelton, and Bonnie Herman.

Dr. Zegree’s choral arrangements have been published by Hal Leonard, Warner Bros., Alfred Publications and Shawnee Press, and he has produced several recordings including Mark Murphy Sings the Nat King Cole Songbook, Vol. I and II, on Muse Records which received a Grammy Award nomination. His piano CD, “Steve Zegree and Friends” is released on the Sea Breeze Jazz label. As pianist with the Western Jazz Quartet he recorded 4 CDs and performed throughout the world. In addition he has performed on keyboards in the national tours of Broadway musicals including “Wicked”, “The Producers”, and “Hairspray”.

Zegree’s first book, “The Complete Guide to Teaching Vocal Jazz,” is published by Heritage Music Press, a division of Lorenz Music Publishing. His recent book, “The Wow Factor: How to Create It, Inspire It and Achieve It,” is published by Hal Leonard Music Publications.

Carolbeth True has been a very active member of the St. Louis musical community for many years. She is adjunct professor at Webster University—teaching jazz and classical piano, and also maintains an extensive private student roster. For years she has led her own group, The Carolbeth Trio, and now is co-leader, along with her son David True, of the group Two Times True. She is the pianist with Hard Bop Heritage, a modern jazz ensemble led by local trumpet legend Randy Holmes; with the Sessions Big Band; with Wind of the Spirit praise band at her church; and is an original member of the cast of The Jazz Story, a 1-hour overview of jazz history at the Sheldon Concert Hall. Carolbeth has backed many name jazz artists, and performed a number of concertos with various orchestras. In 2005, she was named St. Louis Musician of the year by St. Louis Magazine, and was the 2007 recipient of the Excellence in the Arts Award from the Arts and Education Council of Greater St. Louis. Carolbeth received the Riverfront Times Jazz Musician of the Year award in 2008. She is heard on two trio CDs; New World Harmonica Jazz with Sandy Weltman; two Sessions Big Band CDs as well as I’m All Smiles with vocalist Debby Lennon, and most recently on the 2007 collaboration with her son David True on drums: Two Times True, on the Victoria Records label, as well as on the recently-released CD of saxophone-great Larry Johnson entitled “Circles”.

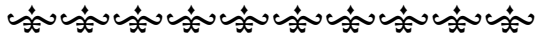

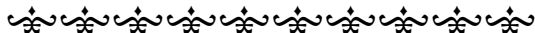
