The strides our Police Department's Citizens Police Academy (CPA) program has made in the past two years have been nothing but grand, and it is without reservation that I say these leaps and bounds would not have been made to such an extent without the help of the LPCPAAA. Whether volunteering among information booths, passing out literature, providing safety tips, or assisting police in traffic control at various parades, festivals, and triathlons, the LPCPAAA volunteers have been an invaluable resource for the past few years. Back in May the CPA had the pleasure of hearing La Porte Chaplin, Walter Swaim of the Abiding Life Baptist Fellowship share his thoughts on volunteerism.

Chaplin Swaim lived in Argentina for eight years before reading about the Florida Police department and then moved to Hollywood, FL in search of ways to serve his community. After 9/11, and later, Hurricane Ike, more training was offered to police chaplains so that they could provide much needed support to the community. Training expanded to new type situations and chaplains are often asked to provide support regardless of the time of day or night.

Chaplin Swaim currently lives in the La Porte area and outside the Abiding Life Baptist Fellowship he offers his service to several chemical plants in the area as well as the LP Police Department.

"Why volunteer?" asks Chaplin Swaim. Because "volunteerism is the fabric of our nation; to step up to serve those who serve us 24/7 and to encourage all to help and volunteer, it is a part of who we are."

2012 Texas CPA Conference Report

First, we would like to extend a monster "Thank You" to the Waco CPAAA and all their volunteers for hosting the 2012 Texas Citizens Police Academy Alumni Law Enforcement Annual Training Conference.

LPCPAAA Second VP, Chris Copley and his wife and member, Vicky Copley will be sharing a detailed summary of their attendance at the conference at Thursday's LPCPAAA meeting. However, we were able to briefly catch up with them to hear about some of their favorite moments.

The pair were charged with attending and representing the LPCPAAA at the conference and using the opportunity to learn from the sessions, network with other CPA associations, and share ideas. As such, they took part in sessions covering Concealed Handguns, DEA, Terrorism (Homeland Security), PACT 360 Police And Communities Come Together about drug usage, and Distractive Driving (for law enforcement).

Chris shared that he was extremely impressed and surprised with many of the training sessions and the level of knowledge gained from each instructor. He particularly enjoyed the stories that painted a clear picture of just what law enforcement is up against these days. For example, PACT360 contains five key programs: Meth360®, Parents360, Youth360, Latino360 and Padres360. These programs provide parents and teens with a "360-degree" view of existing and emerging drug and alcohol issues.

During the PACT 360 session they learned about ways our youth are trying to hide alcohol use through a variety of ways such as, "Plugging", "Candy Soaking", "Eyeballing" and "Smoking Alcohol". Needless to say, the stories were real eye-openers!

After networking with a number of other CPAAA's Chris feels certain that the LPCPAAA is one of the more active and vibrant associations around. In fact, since returning he has already been contacted about our C.O.P. Program.

We will be sharing more about the pair's attendance at the conference on our website and Facebook page. We may even have a photo of Chris with "Willie" Nelson - wink, wink.

New LPPD Program for Women

La Porte Police have a new program to help area women defend themselves against potential assailants. The program is known as the Rape Aggression Defense (RAD) System and is a program of realistic, self-defense tactics and techniques for women only. It is geared toward training for awareness, prevention, risk reduction, and avoidance. By the end of the class participants will progress toward the basics of actual hands-on defense training.
