The Chief Reports....

Chief Adcox spoke at the Alumni meeting on Thursday, November 7 and shared that La Porte ranked among the top 25 safest cities statewide in a recent crime survey.

Currently, the crime rate is exactly equal to the number of crimes last year. No more, no less.

In addition, of the 700 police departments across Texas, La Porte is the only city of 100 which is certified as a Best Practices department. LPPD most recently received their 3-year recertification after completing another successful Best Practices review.

The Chief also reported that the K-9 program retired one of the officers but gained two additional K-9's. The K-9's have recently completed a month long training course and are now in the introduction period with their assigned officer. As a result of the additional K-9's there is now an available K-9 at any time of the day.

Blue Santa and the Animal Shelter has friends in all the right places. There is a program in LP whereby jurors may choose to donate their days pay to a number of local charities. Thanks to a municipal court employee and Chief Adcox, Blue Santa and the Animal Shelter are now part of that program. Plus, after just one case, Blue Santa received two donations and the Animal Shelter one!

Before leaving the meeting, the Chief invited everyone to attend Monday nights City Council meeting as past Chief Richard is presented with the Best Practices Re-Certification on behalf of the LPPD. His presence is important as he was the first Chief to recommend and push to participate in the program. So please stop by if you have a moment to show support for this great accomplishment!


