Today you have received the Parent/Student Handbook. Please take some time to read over the procedures and expectations for a wonderful school year together. There have been a few changes this year, many you are already aware of. These changes are present in the handbook. You received the Handbook Acknowledgement Receipt Form which must be signed and returned to school once you have read the handbook.

There has been much debate over our Peacemaker awards. The faculty and I meet and discussed your concerns and ours. We have decided to replace the Peacemaker awards with a new incentive program. This program allows students to be acknowledged for good behavior and following the rules on a daily basis. Your child will be earning Cardinal Cards on a daily basis. They will be working towards 3 different goals. The first is an individual bi-weekly goal for a small reward the first reward is to earn a "Pick your seat pass". The second goal is a lunch period reward that they will be working together with other students in their lunch period. This reward is given monthly and the first is to enjoy music during their lunch period. The third goal is an all school wide incentive that is given on a quarterly basis. This reward is given when all the students work together as a team. The first quarter reward is that I will dress up like.... We will have to see what that is; personally I can't wait to reward the students. These Cardinal Cards cannot be taken away once earned and are used to praise our students and encourage collaboration rather than competition working together as a community.

I am proud to announce that St. Hilary will once again be adopting a soldier through the Soldier's Angels program. Our soldier this year is Jason, who is stationed in Afghanistan. He is very appreciative of anything that is sent to him and he rooms with three other gentlemen who he is willing to share his gifts with. Each grade will be given a month to write letters and send donations to Jason. Sincere thanks to Ms. Sexton for organizing this project and making sure that Jason receives all the wonderful things that are donated to him.

Parents and guardians – you must make arrangements for your child's transportation to and from all rehearsals and events.
