Emergency Closing/Cold Weather

Cold weather: Students will be kept in for indoor recess when the temperature is below 25 degrees (actually or with wind chill) or in wet rainy/snowy conditions. 

The Rite of Christian Initiation for Children (RCIC).



If you have children five years of age or older who have not been baptized we invite you to consider taking this important first step in the spiritual journey. Whether your family is just entering the Church, returning to the practice of the Catholic faith, or delayed your child's sacramental preparation, all are welcome.

We have a developed a special series that families participate in together called the *Rite of Christian Initiation for Children (RCIC)*. These classes are designed to educate children in the Catholic faith and prepare them for the sacraments, accompanied by their parents and with the support and encouragement of members of the parish community. *We will meet on Sunday mornings beginning at 9:00 am in the school followed by attendance at the 10:00 Mass from February 23 to April 6.* The children will then be baptized during the Easter season. If the child is in first grade or older they will also attend Religious Education classes on Monday evenings as well from 6:30-8:00.

Children who have been baptized and are in first grade should be registered for First Communion instruction (a two year process). Older children who have been baptized, but have not yet received the Eucharist or Reconciliation are also invited to be part of the RCIC. The cost of the program is \$25.00 per student. If they have already been baptized, parents are asked to provide a copy of their child's baptismal certificate.
