As we come upon the last weeks of school please be aware of any balances on your financial obligations. Report cards and transcripts will be held if there are any financial balances. Students may be excluded from any end of the year activities or celebrations until balances are paid in full. Your immediate attention to your obligation is appreciated.

Don't forget to tell a friend about St. Hilary and as a thank you, you will receive a \$100.00 tuition credit on your December tuition statement pending enrollment of the referred family. If you would like to apply for financial assistance for the 2015-2016 school year you need to begin the process by completing the FACTS financial assistance application. The link to this application can be found on our website www.sthilarychicago.org, click on the FACTS logo on the right side to be directed to the application.

Dates to Remember:

- June 4 Preschool's last day. Children arrive at 9:30, celebration begins at 10:00 a.m. in the Vacala Auditorium. Children will be dismissed with their parents after the celebration.
- June 5 Kindergarten's last day. The celebration begins at 10:00 a.m. in the Vacala Auditorium. Children will be dismissed with their parents after the celebration.
- June 6 St. Hilary Community Fest and Grand Raffle drawing
- June 9 St. Hilary Field Day at Green Briar Park
- June 10 Last day of school. 8:30 all school liturgy with awards ceremony immediately following. Children will be dismissed at 1:00 p.m.

Each family will be required to use the FACTS Tuition Management System for the 2015-2016 school year as mandated by the Archdiocese. There are a few choices that you will need to make in setting up your account.

First, you have the choice of having your tuition payments automatically withdrawn from your bank account or you can choose the invoice option. This option will allow you to receive an invoice from FACTS and then your payment can be made either through FACTS or payment may be brought into the school office.

Secondly, you need to choose your payment plan; either full payment (no FACTS service fee) where you will receive a 3% discount on your tuition payment if it is made by September 1st. There is also a 2 payment option (a onetime \$10.00 FACTS service fee) where your tuition balance is divided in two parts, one paid in September and one in January. The final option is a monthly payment plan (a onetime \$30.00 FACTS service fee), spread out over 10 months – August to May.

Your child received an order form for the SchoolKidz tailored pre-packaged supply kits for next year. You have the option of ordering your child a kit either online or with the paper order form. Paper forms are due by June 12th and may be dropped off in the school office. On-line orders are due by June 19th. St. Hilary will receive proceeds from each kit ordered and your child will have the supplies in their classroom on Back to School Meet and Greet Night, August 17th. Save yourself some time and gas money – order one today!!


