

Dear Parent/Guardian,

As the weather turns the flu season will soon be here. Please keep in mind that neither children nor adults are able to focus and learn when they are not 100%. Please allow your child to regain their health and strength before returning to school, this will also help to reduce the spreading of germs to others. Children do need to be fever free for 24 hours before returning to school. We appreciate your cooperation as we continue to keep everyone's safety a top priority.

Speaking of safety, next week in cooperation with the Chicago Police Department we will be having a lockdown drill. Your child has been learning about the importance of this drill. As with any of our drills, the purpose is to keep your child safe. Prior to this drill we will conduct a practice drill. I encourage you to talk to your child to answer any questions they may have. This drill can be compared to using a seat belt in the car, locking the doors in your house, staying near mom and dad while in public, and our monthly fire drills, in regards to their importance. We do not want children to panic or feel that there is a potential threat, there is not, practice is a necessary part of preparedness and foresight.

Our annual Walk-a-thon is Friday, October 9<sup>th</sup>. **Students may not participate if their permission slip is not returned**. A copy is available on the school website under last week's Wednesday envelope if you misplaced your original.

Next week, October 15<sup>th</sup> & 16th we will hold our first trimester progress report conferences. These conferences are mandatory and your child is expected to attend. We are a team and will work together better when everyone is present. Thank you to all the families for returning your conference request forms. The faculty is meeting today to schedule your times and you will receive your confirmation letter with your child's conference time on Friday, October 9th. If you would like to meet with teachers that you have not scheduled a time with please refer to each teacher's schedule which will be posted outside of their class. It is important for us to be respectful of the families whose conferences were scheduled originally. Please be aware that your child will not be receiving a grade for Spanish on their progress report due to Ms. Snediker's late start with us. Thank you for your understanding.
