Reminder:

We pride ourselves on the ability to provide extra-curricular opportunities for all of our children to practice and share their talents. In these situations, the child is issued a warning and then is given a week to show improvements in their

academics, this can range from completing homework, class assignments, failing grades, or inappropriate behaviors that are affecting their academics. If there is no progress after the weeks end, the extra-curricular activity will be taken away (suspension) until such improvement has been shown. This decision will be made by the teacher and Mrs. Donovan. Continued monitoring of the expected improvement will take place and the extra-curricular activity will be reinstated once improvements have been made.

Please review the uniform policy found starting on page 41 of the Parent/Student Handbook found on our school website. There have been a few instances of students wearing shorts after the October 1st cut off, not wearing a belt, and wearing crazy colored socks. 
