Registration for the 2016-2017 school year has begun. This year we will be implementing a new on-line registration process. You received the traditional Powerschool Student Data form to reregister last week if you would like to use that option. Please review the form, make any necessary corrections, complete the tuition payment preference form, and return these forms to

school with the \$100.00 registration fee. The registration fee will increase to \$200.00 for any registration after March 11, 2016. Thank you to the many families who have already completed their registration. We are very fortunate to have new prospective families inquiring about seats for next year, spaces may soon be limited so please be proactive and register early.

This year, once again, St. Hilary will be utilizing the FACTS management program for our financial aid process. There is a link on our school's website for the FACTS program. This is the same organization that serves as our tuition management program. It is more efficient for everyone to incorporate both of these services in one program. The application is now available for you. Please see the letter in today's envelope for more details.

Don't forget to tell a friend about St. Hilary and as a thank you, you will receive a \$100.00 tuition credit on your December tuition statement pending enrollment of the referred family. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated!

The end of the second academic trimester is March 11th. Please make sure your financial obligations to Saint Hilary are taken care of in a timely manner. If you have experienced a change in circumstances please contact Mrs. Donovan to make adjustments to your bill and arrange a payment plan. Per board policy, students whose tuition and fees have not been kept up to date will be subject to exclusion on Wednesday, March 16th.

Please note 8th graders must be paid in full by May. Failure to complete payment will result in loss of participation in 8th grade events/activities and possibly graduation. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated. If your account is current, I thank you!

Emergency Closing/Cold Weather





Around the World in a Lunch Period - Japan

Greetings from the next Culinary Explorations destination, Japan! The name for Japan in Japanese is Nippon. It means "Land of the Rising Sun." Japan was probably settled approximately 35,000 years ago by migrants from the Asian mainland to this archipelago of more than 6,800 islands. Nowadays, Japan's population is estimated at around 127,300,000 people. Japan's economy is the third largest in the world. The country is well known for its cars and consumer electronics.
