Thank you to the 2<sup>nd</sup> & 8th grade faith partners for hosting our family mass on Sunday. It is so important to see our children expressing their faith and participating in the liturgy. Thanks to Mrs. Martin, Mrs. Castle, Ms. Rath, and Mrs. Hopkins for coordinating this mass. During mass our children recalled how St. Patrick explained the Holy Trinity by way of the shamrock. They also reminded us of how the shamrock can represent our Lenten promise to pray, give, and fast.

At St. Hilary School, we recently raised \$1000 to donate to Catholic Charities in Flint. This money reflects collections our students gathered from parishioners at a Sunday liturgy as well as donations from our Silent Lunch for Social Justice which was held March 2<sup>nd</sup>. Each year, since 2001 our Student Council holds this event to raise funds for those in need. Students eat only a small portion of soup and bread while listening to a presentation about our call to serve. Previous years have sent donations as far away as Cambodia and as near as Friedman Place for the Blind across the street from our school. We are proud of our continuing tradition of service.

On Wednesday, March  $2^{nd}$  we participated in Read Across America by inviting DeVry University representatives to read to our preschool –  $2^{nd}$  grade classes. In recognition of Dr. Seuss' birthday each class also received the book that was read to them. Over 440 classrooms, impacting over 11,000 students in over 100 schools participated. We are grateful to have been given this opportunity.

Every player will be invited to participate in instructional clinics, shootout lunch & games.


