Dear Parent/Guardian,

Today your child received their first report card for this school year. This report should be a reflection of the work that they have been completing this first trimester. Parents are able to review all of their child's grades and progress through the parent portal on PowerSchool. These grades should never be a surprise. Please take some time to talk with your child; praise their achievements and make a plan to work on areas where they may be struggling. I also encourage you to keep open communication with your child's teachers, they are here to work together with you. Please sign and return the report card envelope as soon as possible as they will be used throughout the school year.

You are well aware that we have adopted a new math program this year. This program is more rigorous than the accelerated math program that we had been using for the past few years. If you notice a change in your child's math grade please know that this is a learning period for your children, as well as the teachers. The benefits that your child will receive through this new program will benefit them for years to come. Thank you for your patience and understanding.

Please read the letter in the white envelope that was sent to you last week. This letter pertains to our Annual Christmas Fund for the teachers. I appreciate your help in showing our deepest gratitude for their dedication to our children.

Christmas is a very special time of year for many reasons. Each year on Christmas Eve we ask our children to participate in a Christmas pageant at the 5:00 mass. This pageant is a very special St. Hilary tradition that would not be possible without our children participating. I ask that you please consider attending this mass and allowing your child to be an important part of the telling of the story of Jesus' birth. Enclosed in today's envelope is a flyer for you to complete and return to school so that we can prepare the costumes, assign parts, and take some time to practice with the children.



Children's Christmas Eve Nativity Pantomime

This Christmas Eve we will do a pantomime of the Christmas Story at the **5:00 pm Christmas Eve**Mass. We invite all the children of the parish and their guests (i.e. cousins or grandchildren who are visiting) to join in this festive celebration.

If your child wants to be part of the pantomime we ask you to sign the slip below and indicate whether they will be a *shepherd*, angel, or lamb. If your child wants to "dress for the part" costumes need not be elaborate – a



white dress, sweater, or shirt and a halo made of gold or silver garland will do fine for an angel (wings are optional). Shepherds need only come in a bathrobe – a towel fixed on their head with string or a sports band does great for the headgear and staffs or shepherds crooks are allowed but not required. Lambs can dress in white or black. A couple of ears made out of construction paper and cotton balls will be plenty. We do have a few costumes available.

Dressing up is half the fun yet even if your child decides at the last minute to be part of the pantomime or unexpected guests arrive just bring them along.

We will cast the roles of Mary and Joseph and provide those costumes. If your child would like to be Mary or Joseph please indicate below. Once we have all the names of those children we will draw names from a hat to cast the leading roles. If your child's name is not chosen for these roles we hope they will join us in one of the other roles.

We will need a few adults that evening to help us direct the children where to go. If you can help out please indicate that on the sign-up slip.

We hope this will restore some of the festivity to the celebration, make it memorable for our youngest parishioners (pre-school on up) and not add to the stress of an already hectic season.
