#### **Empower Illinois Update:**

Empower Illinois announced that its tax credit scholarship application will open on Tuesday, February 27 at 7 p.m. through its website, <a href="www.empowerillinois.org">www.empowerillinois.org</a>. In addition to the new date and time, Empower Illinois is implementing a change to how it will accept applications. The application will now be a two-step process in an effort to make it more convenient for families and provide more time for them to complete the application. This new process will also help Empower Illinois better manage the expected demand for scholarships.

**Step One – Registration:** On February 27 at 7 p.m., families will complete a brief online form with their name and contact information, child's name and preferred school. The goal of this step is to fulfill the first come, first served nature of the application. Every registration form will be time stamped and will determine each family's place in line to complete the application. Families will be able to access the registration page of Empower Illinois' website from a computer or mobile device.

**Step Two – Application:** After families reserve their place in line by completing the registration form, families will be emailed a unique link to complete the actual application. The application links will be sent on a rolling basis, over a few weeks, so families should not be alarmed if they do not receive a link immediately. After receiving the application email, families will have **three days** to complete the full application and

submit all required documents at a time that is most convenient for them. To help families, Empower Illinois will provide application support through their website and phone helpline (855.318.1222).

It is important to note that scholarships will still be awarded on a first come, first served basis. As mentioned above, Step one of the application process will determine each family's place in line, so it's important that families complete the form as soon as possible on Tuesday, February 27.

Donations will be collected in the morning in your classroom.










# Please participate in Crazy Quarters Day!!

## Fr. Aloy is looking for families and their children to assist with the Holy Thursday liturgy on March 29<sup>th</sup>



**HOLY THURSDAY** is the most complex and profound of all religious observances, saving only the Easter Vigil. It celebrates both the institution by Christ himself of the Eucharist and of the institution of the sacerdotal priesthood (as distinct from the 'priesthood of all believers') for in this, His last supper with the disciples, a celebration of Passover, He is the self-offered Passover Victim, and every ordained priest to this day presents this same sacrifice, by Christ's authority and command, in exactly the same way. The Last Supper was also Christ's farewell to His assembled disciples, some of whom would betray, desert or deny Him before the sun rose again.

The Holy Thursday liturgy, celebrated in the evening because Passover began at sundown, also shows both the worth God ascribes to the humility of service, and the need for cleansing with water (a symbol of baptism) in the Mandatum, or washing in Jesus' washing the feet of His disciples, and in the priest's stripping and washing of the altar. Cleansing, in fact, gave this day of Holy Week the name Maundy Thursday.

The washing of the feet represents the service and charity of Christ, who came "not to be served, but to serve.

Fr. Aloy would like one parent to represent a disciple and their child will assist Fr. Aloy in the drying of the parent's feet. **Each family will need a parent and a child.**
