Dear Parent/Guardian,

Today many schools across the nation participated in National Walk Out Day. We took this as an opportunity to reflect on how we can be peacemakers. At 10:00 am we stopped to prayer and reflect together. In addition we turned Walk Out Day to Walk Up Day; a time to move out of our comfort zones and help others feel more welcome. A time to show kindness rather than judgment. We have the ability to help someone and head off angry impulses or an outbreak of violence.

In honor of those who lost their lives in Florida, I challenged each of us to find 14 students and 3 adults to walk up to and say something nice to honor those who died so tragically on February 14, 2018.

Technology is a part of everyone's lives. We rely on some type of technology every day and for our children, they do not know what it is like to live without this technology. Technology is a tool which has given us instant answers, connections to others that we may not usually be connected to and with that comes the problems of safety. Keeping our children safe is our first priority and this includes using technology responsibly and safely. These publications are: <u>Net Cetera</u>, <u>Living Life Online</u>, and <u>Help, Stop, Think and Connect</u> they were provided by the Federal Trade Commission. I ask that you take time to read through them, talk with your child about how to be online and use technology safely. I hope that they help you through these conversations and enlighten you to our responsibilities when we are online.

This special lunch will take place next Wednesday, March 21. The purpose of this lunch is to bring light to the darkness of the hungry through a \$1.00 minimum donation to be given to Feed My Starving Children. Your child will need to give up the delicious lunch that they are familiar with; however, we know that they are healthy and will enjoy a nutritious meal when they come home. We understand that some children may not be able to participate in this lunch due to medical conditions; however, we do ask that they bring a simple lunch so that they can participate in a special way as well. HOLY THURSDAY is the most complex and profound of all religious observances, saving only the Easter Vigil. It celebrates both the institution by Christ himself of the Eucharist and of the institution of the sacerdotal priesthood (as distinct from the 'priesthood of all believers') for in this, His last supper with the disciples, a celebration of Passover, He is the self-offered Passover Victim, and every ordained priest to this day presents this same sacrifice, by Christ's authority and command, in exactly the same way. The Last Supper was also Christ's farewell to His assembled disciples, some of whom would betray, desert or deny Him before the sun rose again.

The Holy Thursday liturgy, celebrated in the evening because Passover began at sundown, also shows both the worth God ascribes to the humility of service, and the need for cleansing with water (a symbol of baptism) in the Mandatum, or washing in Jesus' washing the feet of His disciples, and in the priest's stripping and washing of the altar. Cleansing, in fact, gave this day of Holy Week the name Maundy Thursday.

The washing of the feet represents the service and charity of Christ, who came "not to be served, but to serve.

Fr. Aloy would like one parent to represent a disciple and their child will assist Fr. Aloy in the drying of the parent's feet. **Each family will need a parent and a child.**

Illinois Tax Credit Scholarship Program Information



EMPOWER ILLINOI TAX CREDIT SCHOLARSHIP UPDATE:

- Encourage families to continue to check their email for the link to the Empower Illinois application in TADS. The email will come from <u>empowerillinois@TADS.com</u>. However, please also note that emails will be sent out over few weeks throughout most or all of March, so if families haven't received an email yet, it probably hasn't been sent yet. As of March 12, emails have only been sent to about 25 30 percent of families who completed a reservation beginning February 27. Remind families to be patient; all families who made a reservation will receive an email inviting them to complete an application.
- When families are completing the School Commitment form, the tuition they should enter for a student should reflect any parishioner and multi-sibling discounts for the particular student. If the family was previously offered additional "unfunded" discounts, or a student previously received Caritas/Phoenix/BSF, they should NOT include this. The benefit of tax credit scholarships is that hopefully families won't need additional discounts, and other scholarships can be directed to another student who doesn't receive a tax credit scholarship.
- Ask families to sign into their TADS account and review their uploads to see if any documents are missing. If it appears there are missing documents and families have questions about what is needed or how to upload, have them call the Empower Illinois Hotline English:<u>855.318.1222</u> or Spanish: <u>612.548.3337</u>.
- All documents MUST BE SUBMITTED within the seven day time frame of when a family receives the application link via email.
- Inform families that Empower Illinois/TADS may call or email them with questions about their application, so check frequently and respond timely.
- If a family needs to change the name of the school selected on their application, they may do so by calling the Empower Illinois/TADS Hotline. (This is important if a family chose "Undecided.")



Mandarin Chinese Enrichment Classes

This year we have been very fortunate to have partnered with Totus Lingua for our Spanish instruction. This partnership has also allowed us to offer Mandarin Chinese classes after school on Wednesdays. The future of the continuation of these classes depends on the interest of our families. In order for a new instructor to be assigned to us we need to have, at least, 2 new students enroll in the class.

If you are wondering if the investment is worth it, here are two parent testimonials about our Chinese enrichment class.

"The after-school Chinese classes have been a great educational experience for my two children. In the past, we have paid a significant amount of money for lessons in a language school and a personal tutor with much less success. In the past five months, my children have moved beyond singing songs and giving basic greetings to full communication with family members in Mandarin. In addition to academic growth, my children are also extremely enthusiastic about the class --they do not view it as work but as a great pleasure, a treat in the middle of the week." - parent

"My son, a second grader, has been taking Mandarin Chinese class thru Totus Lingua for several months at St. Hilary's School. The opportunity is wonderful-and the convenience is amazing because he is able to attend after school gets out in the same building. - 3. Learning Mandarin is easier than you think You do not have to worry about verbs! There are no verbs, no plurals, no tenses, no subject-verb agreement, and no conjugations. In fact, it could be regarded as a more logical language.
- 4. Improve your artistic skills Chinese symbols and characters require a steady hand. The written words are actually iconographic characters rather than letters. These symbols and characters are created using 'strokes' rather like painting.
- 5. Improve your brain power We know we need to keep our brains well oiled and studies have shown that Mandarin speakers use both sides of their brains!
