Sunday, March 25th is Palm Sunday, the beginning of Holy Week, the greatest week in the Church calendar. On Palm Sunday, we gather to herald, with the whole Church, the beginning of the celebration of our Lord's Paschal Mystery, journeying with him into Jerusalem, sitting with him at the Last Supper, standing at the foot of the Cross and keeping vigil at his tomb, awaiting the spectacle of his Resurrection. The Passion will be read with the assistance of two of our students at the 10:00 am mass. All are welcome to worship with us.

Today we continued our traditional Lenten Silent Lunch. Thank you to the Student Council officers for hosting this special time. 

Fr. Aloy is looking for families and their children to assist with the Holy Thursday liturgy on March 29th



HOLY THURSDAY is the most complex and profound of all religious observances, saving only the Easter Vigil. It celebrates both the institution by Christ himself of the Eucharist and of the institution of the sacerdotal priesthood (as distinct from the 'priesthood of all believers') for in this, His last supper with the disciples, a celebration of Passover, He is the self-offered Passover Victim, and every ordained priest to this day presents this same sacrifice, by Christ's authority and command, in exactly the same way. The Last Supper was also Christ's farewell to His assembled disciples, some of whom would betray, desert or deny Him before the sun rose again.

The Holy Thursday liturgy, celebrated in the evening because Passover began at sundown, also shows both the worth God ascribes to the humility of service, and the need for cleansing with water (a symbol of baptism) in the Mandatum, or washing in Jesus' washing the feet of His disciples, and in the priest's stripping and washing of the altar. Cleansing, in fact, gave this day of Holy Week the name Maundy Thursday.

The washing of the feet represents the service and charity of Christ, who came "not to be served, but to serve.

Fr. Aloy would like one parent to represent a disciple and their child will assist Fr. Aloy in the drying of the parent's feet. **Each family will need a parent and a child.**

EMPOWER ILLINOI TAX CREDIT SCHOLARSHIP UPDATE:

- Encourage families to continue to check their email for the link to the Empower Illinois application in TADS. The email will come from <a href="mailto:empower:empower:emailto:empower:empower:emailto:emmower:empower:emailto:emmower:emailto
- When families are completing the School Commitment form, the tuition they should enter for a student should reflect any parishioner and multi-sibling discounts for the particular student. If the family was previously offered additional "unfunded" discounts, or a student previously received Caritas/Phoenix/BSF, they should NOT include this. The benefit of tax credit scholarships is that hopefully families won't need additional discounts, and other scholarships can be directed to another student who doesn't receive a tax credit scholarship.
- Ask families to sign into their TADS account and review their uploads to see if any documents are missing. If it appears there are missing documents and families have questions about what is needed or how to upload, have them call the Empower Illinois Hotline English:855.318.1222 or Spanish: 612.548.3337.
- All documents MUST BE SUBMITTED within the seven day time frame of when a family receives the application link via email.
- Inform families that Empower Illinois/TADS may call or email them with questions about their application, so check frequently and respond timely.
- If a family needs to change the name of the school selected on their application, they may do so by calling the Empower Illinois/TADS Hotline. (This is important if a family chose "Undecided.")

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Mandarin Chinese Enrichment Classes

This year we have been very fortunate to have partnered with Totus Lingua for our Spanish instruction. This partnership has also allowed us to offer Mandarin Chinese classes after school on Wednesdays. The future of the continuation of these classes depends on the interest of our families. In order for a new instructor to be assigned to us we need to have, at least, 2 new students enroll in the class.

If you are wondering if the investment is worth it, here are two parent testimonials about our Chinese enrichment class.

"The after-school Chinese classes have been a great educational experience for my two children. In the past, we have paid a significant amount of money for lessons in a language school and a personal tutor with much less success. In the past five months, my children have moved beyond singing songs and giving basic greetings to full communication with family members in Mandarin. In addition to academic growth, my children are also extremely enthusiastic about the class --they do not view it as work but as a great pleasure, a treat in the middle of the week." - parent

"My son, a second grader, has been taking Mandarin Chinese class thru Totus Lingua for several months at St. Hilary's School. The opportunity is wonderful-and the convenience is amazing because he is able to attend after school gets out in the same building. Having such a fantastic learning experience has shown to be extremely beneficial for him, at a young age having this chance to broaden his knowledge thru other cultures, histories and language such as this-he even wants to learn more at home now and asks about cooking Chinese cuisine, watching documentaries, and reading more books. He states that the class makes learning fun! My son loves learning Mandarin and hopes to continue the classes each week." -parent

Reasons why you would want your child to learn Chinese:

 China is the most widely spoken language in the world - Chinese is the most widely spoken language in the world with approximately 1,197,000,000 people speaking Chinese, of which 873,000 million speak Mandarin, according to <u>infoplease.com</u> therefore 14% of the global population speaking Chinese.

2. It is good for business - many top CEO's speak Chinese as a second language.

- 3. Learning Mandarin is easier than you think You do not have to worry about verbs! There are no verbs, no plurals, no tenses, no subject-verb agreement, and no conjugations. In fact, it could be regarded as a more logical language.
- 4. Improve your artistic skills Chinese symbols and characters require a steady hand. The written words are actually iconographic characters rather than letters. These symbols and characters are created using 'strokes' rather like painting.
- 5. Improve your brain power We know we need to keep our brains well oiled and studies have shown that Mandarin speakers use both sides of their brains!


