Dear Parent/Guardian,

Tomorrow we will celebrate the Fun Run at 1:30 pm in the parking lot. All are welcome, we hope you are able to join us!!! With our big goal of raising \$20,000 towards helping our school's vitality, we asked the Fun Run experts at Boosterthon to power our Fun Run and make it more profitable, easier, and fun. <u>Tonight is the last night to get your pledges in. Your child has been solving mysteries in the Mind Spark Mystery Lab while learning important character traits; take a moment to ask them about these traits. It is one of our goals to make this an educational experience on top of all the fun and prizes!!!!

Parking lot safety:

Your child is your most precious gift and that is why their safety is our number 1 priority. Reports regarding behaviors of parents in the parking lot and in front of school that I have received or have seen with my own eyes puzzle me. I have been very clear that we are all responsible for the safety of our children as they arrive and depart from school. Parents you MUST act as if every child is your child! Cars racing into the parking lot, entering the wrong gate, dropping off children directly in front of the doors, and exiting without taking time to look for children are all unacceptable. I WILL NOT have one of our children hurt because someone is in a rush or did not take a second to see a child. I have included the parking lot procedures that were previously sent home as a reminder to you. If these behaviors do not change I will have no other choice but to lock the lot and keep it for the children only. This would be a terrible inconvenience, I understand; however, our children are more important and they come first.

Each morning I remind everyone during announcements to be kind to one another. This is who we are and this is an expectation not an exception. It has been necessary to have staff supervise arrival and dismissal for your child's safety and I am hearing that parents – adults are being rude and disrespectful to the staff and to other children. This behavior is not tolerated by our students and it certainly is not tolerated by adults – parents.

I appreciate your cooperation and understanding regarding these situations. I am hopeful that these issues will be quickly resolved and we can move along with a wonderful school year.

St. Hilary Art Programs:

As you know, fine arts are a big deal here at St. Hilary. Here is a message from Mrs. Rhodes, our extremely talented art teacher. Please visit Artsonia.com. Artsonia helps support the Art program at St. Hilary and it is an important component in you child's art education. Each student uses an ipad to photograph and upload their art into Artsonia. They also create a title for the work and write an Artist Statement. Their digital portfolio is accessible to the public only if you give them permission. Otherwise their work is not seen online. The portfolio is maintained by the site and each year students are adding to the site. This allows them to build up a body of work of not only visual art they have created but also writing samples. 8th grade reminders:

Medical forms:

According to the Illinois State Board of Education students are to be excluded from school by October 15 if these health and immunization requirements have not been met.

This program is completed online and you will receive a certificate which you need to submit to school and it will be kept on file.
