SCENIC SETTING Clubhouse set into the hillside, Minne Monesse isn't your typical flat Illinois prairie course.

Charming and out-of-the-way, but always a test, Minne Monesse Golf Course has a new owner.

After 38 years, the **Hurley** family sold the gem of Grant Park to **Anthony Wunsch** of Crown Point, Ind. early in February. The price was not disclosed, but the Hurleys put Minne Monesse up for sale at \$1.2 million last July.

Wunsch is only the fourth owner of the Kankakee County layout since it was opened as a nine-hole course, designed by **William Watson** – he of the longgone third course at Olympia Fields, San Francisco's Olympic Club and the recently-shuttered South Shore Country Club in Momence – in 1926.

Dennis Sullivan was the pro there – and the postmaster of Grant Park's post office – when the original owners shuttered it before the 1943 season, knowing that World War II gas rationing would stop players from driving from the south suburbs. In 1961, Sullivan's son **Tommy** bought the course and not only reopened it, but hired architect Ted Lockie to add nine holes.

The reworked course opened in 1964. Quickly, what regulars had called "The Proving Ground" was thriving again.

Sullivan sold to **Ed Hurley** in 1981, and the fun continued. But with Bloomington's Crestwicke Country Club under his family's wing, two courses distant from each other proved too much, and the course was put up for sale.

A remodeling early in the 2000s by **Bob Lohmann** brought three new holes to the property – plus the closing of the original ninth, a vexing volcano par 3 where those hitting over the green risked breaking a car windshield in the parking lot beyond – and the platting of a dozen or so lots for homes.

Anderson, Russell are two of our own

t's a phrase that goes back a century and more in Chicago government, which is to say Chicago politics.

"Who's your clout?"

In other words, who's your backer for this idea, or scheme, or swindle? Who can make it happen?

Without clout, nothing happens in Chicago. It was that way with the original mayor Daley's Democratic machine, and for mayors before and since.

When Tip O'Neill – another Democratic pol – said "All politics is local," this is what he meant.

Guess what? All golf is local. It's about who you know, who those you know know, and so on.

On the national scene, Chicagoans – Illinoisans, for that matter – haven't had anyone we know on the major governing boards of the USGA or PGA of America for quite a while.

Remember Buzz Taylor? The north suburban business magnate was president of the USGA the last time the U.S. Open played through town. And 2003 at Olympia Fields is now a long time ago.

Remember Roger Warren? He began to work his way up the PGA of America leadership ladder while the head pro at Seven Bridges Golf Course in Woodridge, and was the president – though by then hailing from Kiawah Island in South Carolina – when the PGA Championship was held at Medinah Country Club in 2005.

Coincidence? Not quite. Especially in the

case of the USGA, the championship committee and executive committee occasionally send the big show, the U.S. Open, toward the area where their officers hail from. Not always, but often enough. Those officers join the committee years before and their voice in favor of a particular course is heard. Make a persuasive case and have it backed up by interest from the club, and the roulette wheel can spin in your favor.

This is not to say the fix is automatically in. Maybe in the late 1960s, when Hazeltine National near the Twin Cities got the 1970 U.S. Open because Totton Peavey Heffelfinger – we don't make these names up – was the club's founder and a former USGA president. Tot, as he preferred to be called, did some arm-twisting and his old pals handed Hazeltine the Open.

That was the course Dave Hill said could be improved by adding 80 acres of corn and some cows. Bob Rosburg said there were so many doglegs, Lassie must have designed it. The Robert Trent Jones layout has been greatly improved since, and has ably hosted another U.S. Open, plus the PGA Championship and Ryder Cup, but that 1970 Open, won by Tony Jacklin, bared the course as not ready for the big show.

Connections help.

Chicago is connected again. The USGA's annual meeting on this last weekend of the month sees the confirmation of Tony Anderson to the executive committee. He didn't play golf until he was 28, but took to it instantly.

Connected in the extreme, Anderson's a member of Chicago Golf Club, is on the board of the RTA and of World Business Chicago and chairs the board at Perspectives Charter School. He spent 35 years at and retired as vice chair of Enrst & Young. He sits on many corporate boards.

Chicago also has a voice on the PGA of America board, and has since last year, when Terry Russell, who currently hangs his shingle at Medinah's teaching facility, began a three-year term as the District 6 representative. The Illinois PGA section president in 2007-08, Russell's always been active in board matters, and knows how to make a point in a meeting.

Sites for the PGA Championship and Ryder Cup have been assigned for a decade out, but it's good to know that at least there's someone from the capital of the Midwest who can explain the benefits of bringing a tournament to town.

The PGA of America has been Midwest-centric with the Ryder Cup in recent years – Medinah, Valhalla near Louisville, Hazeltine have all had it, and Whistling Straits will have it in 2020 – but the U.S. Open's been played once in the region since 2003. That was 2017 at Erin Hills. Sorry, Pittsburgers, Oakmont is not in the Midwest even if Penn State is in the Big Ten. Every Open through 2027 (Pebble Beach, also the site this year) has been assigned.

Hope, then, that Tony Anderson distributes maps of the U.S. with Illinois circled at his first meeting. With arrows pointed at Chicago.



Bolingbrook dome now the only one in the U.S. with innovative ball-tracking system

cience fiction has a funny way of becoming science fact.

Remember the original *Star Trek* series? Except for the transporter – created by producers as a stylish jump-cut to segue from the ship to the planet of the week – all the high-tech gadgets in the show are now real, or have been surpassed. Spock had a flip phone, not an iPhone.

Science fact has come to golf in the form of ball-tracking technology. What was a dream realized for video-game designers came to the real world in the middle of the last decade, when Pro-Tracer first appeared on television screens during the 2006 Solheim Cup.

Now it's the unusual telecast that doesn't feature the colored line racing across the screen like a rainbow from tee to, hopefully, fairway or green.

ProTracer became Toptracer when TopGolf bought it a couple of years ago, a move that paved the way to bring it to a golf dome near you. The Mistwood Golf Dome in Bolingbrook, to be specific. Walk in there, and all the usual golf dome characteristics are there – almost. The familiar targets are gone, replaced by different targets that match up what will pop up on the monitors. Oh, and are there monitors. One at each of the 30 hitting bays facing the golfer, plus another to the back for the golfer's pals to see the action.

Action? In a golf dome? Yes.

This is Advanced Dome Golf 301. Hit a shot or two, and it's like being in *The Matrix*. Better

yet, like being at Pebble Beach, or a myriad of other courses that can be played just as if you're swatting balls 10 feet into a golf simulator backdrop.

This is the secret of Toptracer Range. It takes the simulator experience and broadens it to a football field-sized environment. You can see the ball flight, and then turn to the monitor and see the calculated result in eight categories, accurate to a foot, according to Toptracer Chicago sales manager Matt Vinge.

It feels like real golf. And the numbers tell a story. Mistwood pro Andy Mickelson, as traditional as they come, realized the power of the experience right away.

"The feeling I have now is, having gone back to Mistwood and hitting balls one day, that was the same feeling I have when I leave my cell phone at home," Mickelson said. "It was this naked feeling. I have to have this data now, right next to me, when I'm hitting balls. I think for the serious golfer, this is the absolute. This is where everything's going. It has to go here."

It's here, as in the Mistwood Golf Dome, and exclusively there in the United States through the middle of 2020.

"Andy Mickelson and (general manager) Dan Bradley, they're the ones that really scoped this thing out, found it, investigated it," Mistwood owner Jim McWethy said when the system was unveiled. "The credit goes to those guys. The only thing I had to do was say yes, which was a real easy decision, and write a few checks, which is not usually an easy decision, but when you have an opportunity like we have with Toptracer, it was easy as heck."

McWethy does nothing by half measures. A look at the revitalized course he has in Rome-

oville, then enhanced by the performance center and clubhouse he built – more checks written - to complement it, confirms that. Now, having already refurbished the old Ditka Dome into a clean environment, his vision has moved what was called McQs for the first few years under his ownership into the next realm of indoor practice centers.

"These are the people we wanted to partner with," Vinge said. "This is our biggest installation to date, with 30 bays. We're very excited about this.

"We want to, No. 1, enhance the practice,

make it so people are engaged in their practice, helping the avid golfer. No. 2, we want to bring what TopGolf does, the value of entertainment. Sixty-five percent of the people who come to Top-Golf consider themselves non-golfers. Of that, 20 percent become golfers. That's a huge number for us. We want non-golfers to become golfers."

One of the arguments against golf by the Future Shock generation, those accustomed to constant sensory stimulation, is the slow pace. Not with Toptracer Range. The pace is up to you.

The future of golf practice is not in the future. The future is now. Beam us in, Scotty.

The dome is your winter home

There are hints of spring in the air, at least some of the time. That flirtation with the 50s a couple of weeks ago was such a hint. More is coming when the calendar blessedly turns to March.

Until then, it's best to stay indoors when honing your swing. For one thing, you'll keep your shoes unmuddied. For another, it's so much better to not walk around with a runny nose and an icicle forming on it. But that's just us.

Where the golf buzz begins

Soft and hard sell is all around at PGA Merchandise Show

he pitch was both outlandish and humorous.

"This has never been done in golf before," said the pitchman to a potential client on the big range at Demo Day for the PGA Merchandise Show.

What? Was he kidding?

Everything old in golf is new again. Metal woods weren't new when Gary Adams reintroduced them in the early 1980s. He perfected them and that revolutionized the game. Long putters

weren't new, nor same-length irons.

Thus the outlandishness of the pitch.

But, pity golf's version of Willy Loman. He was trying to make it rain on a sunny day outside of Orlando. One big sale could not only pay for the trip but make a profit for his firm, which was selling some golf widget.

That's the PGA Merchandise Show in a nutshell. The big manufacturers, the small ones, those in-between along with all the gadget gurus and seemingly anyone who ever plugged in a sewing machine with the intention of making a profit – with the major exception of TaylorMade – made the pilgrimage to central Florida to show their stuff to just about every golf pro and shop manager in the land, and many from overseas.

The regular public can't get in, which is too bad. This is a trade show for sellers and show-offs, and also a place to be seen. Mere mortal club pros lined up to get John Daly's autograph on the first day, and he wasn't near a Hooters. Other players of note made appearances on a corner stage. Golf Channel tried to make sense of it all. (Hint: It's about the money.)

It's also a place to see where the wind is blowing in the game. With public course play down

about 17 percent in the Chicago area last year, the wind had better be favorable.

It may be. Equipment people say they think so, though at a trade show, it's difficult to find a cynic with an order book in hand. The parking lots alone are a sign of good fortune, at least for the three-day run at the Orange County Convention Center, a mammoth structure expanded several times as the show, which started in a golf course parking lot, turned into the industry's sales beacon.

What there wasn't this year, despite the howls of marketers and our pal at home on the range, was something so remarkable that it would be worth remarking about. Innovation has been replaced by incremental improvement. One gets the feeling that, given manufacturers are always thinking three to five years out, they could speed up the process and introduce clubs prototyped for 2023

or 2024 now. But what would they sell then?

Therein, at least for manufacturers, lies the marketing rub. Detroit introduces new models, or tweaks old ones, annually. Golf has no set calendar, as TaylorMade proved one year by pushing a new driver out of the plant three times in 12 months. That didn't work.

So every 12 months, then, come the tweaks. For drivers, those are always leaning these days against the USGA distance standard. As a club designer once said of his work on drivers, "The goal is to expand the sweet spot, where we get maximum distance, across the entire face of the club. Then, my work is done."

And there will be 13 clubs to go. Until then, the countless aisles of the PGA Merchandise Show will be worth prowling in the hope that the sweet spot has been expanded, at least incrementally.

Wilson Golf is on the rebound

Chicago's pioneer golf manufacturer using Cortex, promotion to win back users

t has taken years, but Wilson Golf appears to be turning the corner. For a long time stuck in the corners of pro shops, if they were in the shop at all, thanks to a series of bone-headed business decisions by previous ownership, the century-plus-old Chicago-based brand is back in the conversation.

In some ways, it started with a television game show. "Driver vs. Driver," telecast by Golf Channel at the end of 2016, was a reality show between teams of outside club designers vying for the prize of designing Wilson's new driver.

People noticed. More noticed when a snafu forced Wilson to recall the winner, the Triton, was a hair over USGA guidelines thanks to Golf Channel's following FCC game show rules to the letter. The club was on the way to outlets before the final approval that didn't come, and all those clubs came back to the factory to be retooled.

However, what Wilson did there was something that no golf company had done. It opened the factory doors – a little – and showed potential customers this was a modern golf company.

Fast-forward two years, and the Cortex driver, the winner last fall of "Driver vs. Driver2," has been selling since day one. No recalls this time. The company's new D7 irons sold out their first run in Australia. The company has more players playing Wilson on the PGA Tour than in years.

Credit the firm's research and development staff for much of the success, but also credit president Tim Clarke, whose vision since he took over 13 years ago was to return Wilson to the position of industry leader it had been for decades.

"For a 100-year-old company to act like a start-up is sort of what we had to do," Clarke said

at the PGA Merchandise Show. "With Driver vs. Driver, we decided to try something really ambitious and different, so non-traditional.

"We refocused in the categories we had heritage in. No. 1 was in the iron category, where we had great market share, and we focused on the soft ball category. That was one of the big intro-



ductions, the 50-compression ball. People said we didn't know what we were doing, but our consumer research said people preferred the feel of a soft ball as long as the ball did the same thing. Six out of the eight top-selling golf balls are in the soft category. So I guess we've created a category. Being imitated is the finest form of flattery. I'm proud we were first."

Clarke has rebuilt Wilson's brand to outsiders and its reputation to insiders.

Go back far enough, and Wilson Sporting Goods ruled the world of golf.

Spalding and MacGregor were the biggest rivals, with the Acushnet Process Co. in New England gaining attention for its golf balls.

That was 70 years ago and more, and golf's business hierarchy has been overturned several times since. Acushnet renamed itself Titleist and is the golf ball of choice to many. MacGregor, which passed Wilson in the name players touting it by the 1970s, is still around – barely – now a boutique manufacturer after five owners in little more than a decade treated it like a hot potato.

Spalding? The company founded by pioneer Cubs star A.G. Spalding gave up its other sports lines, including Etonic, and renamed itself Top-Flite after its leading ball. And that ball is mostly found in discount stores.

That's where Wilson found itself via one of the bigger golf business missteps in the game's history.

Like MacGregor and Spalding, it bounced between conglomerate companies with varying degrees of success. It was gobbled up by Ling-Temco-Vought in 1967 – if you remember LTV you're a business historian – and sold by LTV to PepsiCo, the mammoth soft drink and fast food company, three years later.

PepsiCo ran Wilson for 15 years. In the eyes of most in golf, ran it into the ground.

"PepsiCo made some distribution decisions," Clarke said. "They kind of looked at golf like package goods. They were using it more as a training ground. They opened premium equipment to anybody who had a pulse and that really hurt us. It was at a time when we were basically the No. 1 ball on tour, pushing Titleist. When you open distribution and disrupt your ecostructure, you get a lot of people angry at you."

PepsiCo quickly learned you can't sell golf equipment the way you sell Pepsi and Fritos, two of their biggest brands. It didn't take long for others to realize the front office didn't care until losses – \$16.7 million in 1984 – prompted a sale.

Two owners later, Finland-based Amer Sports, which briefly also owned MacGregor, brought in Clarke to right the ship.

"Since I've taken over, it's about doing the right things," Clarke said. "It's about clear distribution strategies, it's about premium equipment. We've walked away from almost all the Walmart business. We still have some golf balls in there, but so does everybody else. But we were the Walmart / KMart package set. That's what PepsiCo went after. Anybody that's going after that low end historically has not been able to maintain it. It's hard to make money at that low end."

Wilson now aims high. And it has something to sell. The Cortex has received good reviews.

"We've had good success from the southern markets from the get-go and we expect that to creep north shortly, as the season opens up," Clarke said.

The D7 irons have also found their spot in the market.

"We've got a great technology in those irons with the power holes in the sole," Clarke said. "They modify; in the longer irons we have three rows and in the scoring irons we actually have one row. That's because you want to tighten the dispersion. Distance when you want it, precision when you need it, is the tag line. I think it's going to be a home run. We've had an early sell-through in places like Australia where it's already in season. It's outperforming anything we've done in the last couple years."

Wilson had an effective iron set in the Fat Shaft, but it came out in 1997, just when individual fittings began to take hold. Fat Shaft clubs, because of the shaft, couldn't be modified. Out they went when Clarke was named general manager in 2006.

The next year, Wilson's market share in irons was 0.6 percent. Under Clarke, total sales actually went down for a time but the golf division moved back into the black. Now only the logo was red.

Padraig Herrington's winning three of six majors in 2007-08, boosting recognition and sales, especially in Europe, also was a boost.

Wilson could become one of the big boys again, rejoining Callaway, Titleist, Ping and TaylorMade. One thing is sure: What's in the vending machines in the company break rooms.

"Coke everywhere," Clarke quipped. "No Pepsi, Coke."




Sixty-three holes of exciting golf embedded in luxury await visitors a few miles from Illinois' original boom town

am always struck by the superlatives needed to justly describe Eagle Ridge Resort & Spa. Across the 57,915 square miles that make up Illinois, no land compares to the hills and dales that create the breathtaking scenery of The Galena Territory. As a resort destination, no other property in the state boasts 63 holes of championship golf. As a storyline, no other locality in the Land of Lincoln incorporates a colorful history that weaves lead mining together with nine Civil War generals, Mark Twain and luxury lifestyles.

Long before America's independence, northwestern Illinois was listed on a French map as "mines de plumb" due to the rich deposits to silver sulfide, calcite, fluorite and lead sulfide found across the region. The main ore of lead is called galena. When a specific corner in Western Illinois was discovered to be rich in this valuable mineral, the Upper Mississippi Lead Mine District was established by the Congress in the early 1800s. The district's hub town was named Galena in 1826.

Only a few decades into its existence, Galena was the busiest port between St. Paul and St. Louis. As many as 15 steamboats at a time docked along Water Street. At the height of the lead boom, 54 million pounds of lead were shipped annually from a city which had quickly grown to over 10,000 by 1828 – remarkable considering Chicago's population in 1830 was about 100.

Even as mining made Galena a boom town, the area's raw beauty and proximity to rail service and the Mississippi River made it an attractive vacation by the 1850s. When Ulysses S. Grant returned to visit Galena (where he'd run a leather

goods store with his brothers) following the Civil War, over 25,000 from across the Midwest descended on the town to greet him. Wealthy supporters went so far as to build the general a new house as a gift. Even though Grant and his family rarely stayed at the home following his election as president, the Grant Home remains a signifi-

cant tourist attraction to this day. The construction of U.S. Grant Highway in the mid-1920s (now Highway 20, but still featuring his portrait on road signs) brought Galena a second economic boom that included restaurants, shops and hotels.

In hindsight, it is hard to believe that it wasn't until 1970 that the spectacular 6,800-acre land

was developed just outside of Galena to create Eagle Ridge Resort & Spa. The rolling hills and scope of the Galena Territory make the property one of the state's most dramatic landscapes. How dramatic? From at least one vantage point (the 14th tee on The General golf course), hotel guests can see parts of both Iowa and Wisconsin. Even before the completion of the resort's construction, golf was planned as an anchor of the complex. The acclaimed father and son design team of Larry and Roger Packard was hired to build the North Course in 1975. A year following the formal opening of Eagle Ridge Resort & Spa in 1981, the South Course was designed by the Packards and opened to national acclaim in 1984.

The fireworks didn't stop there. In 1991, after the delightful nine-hole East Course was built and the main lodge and conference center were reconstructed following a fire, plans were made for a

marquee course on rugged land located near the complex's entrance. Designed by Roger Packard and two-time U.S. Open champion Andy North, The General was an instant sensation when it opened in 1997, earning best course of the year honors issued by national golf magazines. To this day it holds a place in most Top 100 You Can Play in the USA lists.

While Eagle Ridge always maintained its status as the state's premier golf resort, new management has invested millions of dollars and resources to raise the golf courses and the entire resort facility to new standards of excellence. A recent visit featured elegant accommodations, excellent food, thoughtful personnel and spectacular golf.

As a visitor to Eagle Ridge since its inception, I have long held a close affinity to the original two golf courses that brought fame to the resort. While neither the North nor South courses can

match The General in topography or spectacular scenery, both belong on any reviewer's list of the state's top 20 layouts. The front nine of the North Course begins on a flat piece of land and then gracefully snakes its way into a lush valley before climbing upwards to the spectacular par-3 eighth hole.

An elevated tee overlooks a small finger of Lake Galena. A large horizontal bunker in front of the green actually serves as a friend to the golfer whose tee shot falls short of the green, serving to keep the ball from rolling back into the lake. A large circular green rests inside a cove of mature trees and a bunker including a rock formation. This hole, alone, is a reason to play the course.

After a trip up the ridge to play the ninth hole, the course very quickly drops back into a valley on the epic par-5 No. 11, which begins on an elevated tee and funnels toward a protected green.

Par or better here foretells a good final score.

The highlight of the back nine is another long par 5, the 566-yard sixteenth. A good tee shot is required to set up a daring downhill pitch shot to a green tucked into a cove. Club selection on this approach is critical due to a drop-off of over 40 feet to the flagstick.

The South Course is only a short drive away from its counterpart yet rests on far hillier and rugged terrain. What looks like a grassy ski slope from the clubhouse steps is actually the fairway of the spectacular downhill eighteenth. The primary hazard on it is a relatively narrow stream which comes into play on 11 holes. While the course starts with a flat, winding par 5, it quickly moves into a cove of woods which protects the second green. More woods, water and a rock outcropping are all presented on the tight No. 3.

The front nine highlight is the beautiful but difficult 174-yard seventh. While the hole plays slightly shorter due to an elevated tee, forest to

the left of the green and a natural wall of grass and stone to the right force an extremely accurate shot. Par here feels like a birdie.

The highlight of the back nine is the aforementioned par 4 eighteenth. Enjoy the splendid view before you play the hole as the tee shot itself might lead to a bogey or worse. Besides the severe elevation change, woods left and right are complemented by the aforementioned stream which cuts across the fairway. Playing short of the stream, a prudent move, sets up a long approach to a large elevated green. What a hole!

The name for The General is a nod to Ulysses S. Grant, naturally. Almost everything about this course is outsized – the span of the golf course, the amazing view on some holes, the unique challenges a few holes present. Like a classic opera, the course starts slowly and then builds to a spectacular finish. My favorite front nine hole is the 505-yard sixth, which doglegs right around a pond as it climbs upwards on a ridge. A long tee shot

is required as the hole narrows on the second shot and the final approach to a large, rolling green.

No report on The General is complete without a description of the stunning par-4 fourteenth. An argument can be made that the view from this tee, alone, is worth the cost of the green fee. Perched 180 feet above the fairway, the tee provides a stunning view of the Wisconsin, Illinois and Iowa landscape. With the severe elevation change, it is downright disorienting to calculate the distance to the landing area. The best play is to hit a fairway wood or hybrid off the tee to set up a short approach to the green. Woods left and right make that task difficult.

Along with fine golf, Eagle Ridge Resort & Spa also boasts some of the Midwest's best resort accommodations. The inn offers elegant rooms providing instant access to restaurants, an indoor pool and the Stonedrift Spa. Guests have the option of renting homes and villas, some built deep in isolated wooded areas. The villas are available in one- to three-bedroom configurations while home options go from three- to six-bedrooms.

Activities at the resort encompass everything from horseback riding to ziplining to fishing to hiking/biking to hot air balloon rides. Truth be told, one of the highlights of any visit to the resort is the sight of hot air balloons rising above the valley just after sunrise. And don't forget Galena!

Sand Valley is now a destination

accept the premise that if you have one 18-holer you have a golf course, but if you have two – or more – you have a golf destination.

Well, Sand Valley is definitely a golf destination now. This Mike Keiser-developed facility in Central Wisconsin opened its first course on May 2, 2017. Designed by the widely respected architectural team of Bill Coore and Ben Crenshaw, that course was called simply Sand Valley. It was well received, of course.

Keiser, though, always planned to have more than one course here. So, preview play was permitted at the second course, Mammoth Dunes, late in the 2017 season and the David McLay Kidd design opened officially in 2018. So did The Sand Box, a 17-hole par-3 course that was already the site of Sand Valley's first significant competition. The new Wisconsin State Par-3 Championship was held there in July. The Sand Box is also a Coore-Crenshaw design with Jimmy Craig also on the credit line.

Mammoth Dunes, though, is the course which took Sand Valley to destination status, like Keiser's other American project, Bandon Dunes in Oregon. The courses at both resorts are walking-only, though carts are available for those with medical issues.

Lots of Amerian golf destinations offer a variety of courses, and we've been blessed to

experience many of them. Bandon, with its four courses and a 13-hole par-3 layout, is clearly the best golf resort in America from this perspective. Sand Valley is still in its fledgling stage and might get there eventually.

For now, though, this focus is on Mammoth Dunes which — I'm comfortable in declaring — the most fun golf course I've ever played. And that's saying a lot. There are a lot of fun courses out there.

More than anything golf is supposed to be

fun. Mammoth Dunes is that – and it would be even when your golf ball isn't always going in the "right" direction.

David McLay Kidd is a Scottish architect who designed the first course at Bandon Dunes 20 years ago. At Mammoth the fairways are wide and the greens are huge. No. 18 at Mammoth has the largest putting surface on the property – nearly a half-acre. Though water barely comes into play on any of the 36 holes, the fairways and greens on both courses are filled with

bumps and mounds and impacted by bunkers and hazards that stimulate your thinking. You don't lose many golf balls, though.

The course has a bonafide drivable par-4 hole. Many "drivable par-4s" don't deserve that description. They're that for only the select long-ball hitters, but I know Mammoth Dunes' No. 14 fits the bill. I drove the green from the white tee, 261 yards with a strong helping wind and a downhill path to the putting surface. It'd been over 20 years since I'd driven a par-4, so it was quite a thrill even though a three-putt followed.

But I digress. This hole has an interesting history and Kidd doesn't get all the credit for it. Brian Silvernail gets partial credit. A Florida resident, he won Golf Digest's Armchair Architect contest in 2016 and Kidd incorporated his design of this hole into the Mammoth Dunes rotation.

One thing that's a must when you play Mammoth Dunes – at least for the first time – is a good caddie and, in local guy Luke Jackson, we had the best. A bag-toter is desirable for more than just making the seven-mile hike less of a physical challenge. A lot of shots aren't what they might first appear at Mammoth Dunes. Go with your gut and you're sure to get burned. Take an experienced caddie and you'll do much better. Either way, though, you'll enjoy the Mammoth experience.

It was impressive to see how far Sand Valley has come in the three years since we hiked the sandy hills with Michael Keiser Jr, Mike's son, prior to the resort's opening. The first course, Sand Valley, is more challenging than Mammoth Dunes.

Mammoth – at 6,988 yards from the tips — is an insignificant 50 yards longer, but both are par-73 layouts. The fifth hole on Sand Valley

was built at the highest point on the property. It's not the toughest short hole on the property, though. That label easily goes to Sand Valley's 17th, which presents an uphill blind tee shot to a green 236 yards away from the back tee.

Sand Valley's two courses are all about elevation changes, and they can confound golfers.

None of the 10 par-5s on the property play as long as Sand Valley's fourth – 593 yards from the tips. For those into numerical comparisons

Sand Valley tops off at a 73.2 rating with a 134 slope. For Mammoth it's 72.4 and 132.

The rap on Sand Valley is the shortage of lodging. Wisconsin, as a state, isn't long on chain hotels, either.

More lodging is being built in and around Sand Valley to fill the need and the town of Wisconsin Rapids, a 20-minute drive away, has a variety of options. We used Hotel Mead there and the dining options are more numerous there as well.

Wisconsin is known for its supper clubs and fish fries, and we found the Branding Iron in Wisconsin Rapids provides a great flavor of the area. The resort itself has an upscale dining room and more informal pub and non-golfing locals like to hang out around Sand Valley's snack bar to watch the golfers tee off and finish their rounds. That fun setting complements the players' enjoyment on the course.

Now, I don't put much stock in the course ratings published annually by the various golf publications. In this case, though, it's worth mentioning that Sand Valley was Golf Digest's Best New Course of 2017 and Golf Magazine labeled it Best New Course You Can Play.

That's lofty praise, and Mammoth Dunes should be a lock for the same honors in 2018 and similar honors beyond.

Hi-ho, hi-ho, come to the Golf Show

Three-day exposition in Rosemont starts season with 140 golf-connected exhibitors

n earlier pages, we noted that the PGA Merchandise Show didn't have, as it often does, that one product that set the golf world on its collective ear and set rival manufacturers into panic catch-up mode.

Think Titleist introducing the Pro V1, relegating balata balls to golf museums.

Think Adams Golf bringing the modern metal wood to the market. Some people thought it was an optical illusion.

The real problem with golf's biggest trade show is just that – it's a trade show. The regular punter – you – can't get in. There aren't even windows to lean against, hoping for a surprise view of a 7-iron.

Plus, it's in Orlando, a long commute.

There's a solution. Come to Rosemont from Friday through Sunday and take in the 36th Chicago Golf Show, the annual three-day bash that commences the local golf season. This is consumer-friendly in the extreme. You can hit golf balls to test the new clubs, swat a few and have an Illinois PGA pro give you an instant lesson – this is worth the price of admission – try to win a something better than a Kewpie doll (two tickets to the BMW Championship, to be precise) by sinking a long putt, think about buying an artificial green for the back yard from the several installers on hand, scoop up brochures from clubs around the Midwest and more distant – and currently warm-

er – points, and schmooze with fellow golf pals, who will undoubtedly be there.

The particulars are on the map of the show floor on the next page, and an easy-to-read directory of 140 golf-connected exhibitors are on page 20. We left out those not golf-connected so we didn't have to go to 6-point type.

If you spent five minutes at each booth, you'd need nearly 12 hours to take in the show. The show is open for 22 hours across three days, but you'll likely be there for just one, so we advise you to save your feet and pick your spots thusly:

- Interested in new clubs? The tryout area is to the right as you walk in the door of the show. Chicago's two major manufacturers, Wilson and Tour Edge, are there, along with Srixon, Callaway and Mizuno.
- Interested in buying a club or a set? Turn left as you walk in, as most of the retailers are on that side of the floor. But swing to the right side as well, as some sellers are there. And don't forget the back of the hall.
- Interested in taking a buddy trip? Resorts and destinations of all types are all over the floor.
- Looking for a local course? They're all about as well, many offering deals for advance signups to play, and almost everyone with a rate card on the table. (While discounting is anathema to many course operators, others see it as getting someone in the tent, hoping they'll pay full price later. The Chicago Golf Show is a perfect place to window shop.)

- The golf groups will be there, of course. The Illinois PGA runs the indoor range, while the CDGA offers on-site handicap renewal, the IJGA is looking for the next generation of players, and the WGA is promoting the return of the BMW Championship at posh Medinah Country Club. It was last there under the original hallowed name of the Western Open in 1966, when Billy Casper triumphed.
- There's more. You can pick up a print of a beautiful painting by Frankfort-based artist Steve Lotus, who first dipped a brush into golf with the 1977 U.S. Senior Open at Olympia Fields, and since has become a leading illustrator of the playing fields of the game.

You can also pick up a pointer or three during presentations on the Main Stage, including an appearance by former Bears kicker Robbie Gould, who will be on hand at 10 a.m. Saturday and Sunday. Surely he'll have advice on keeping drives between the uprights. Former Bears Patrick Mannelly and Emory Moorhead will also be on stage.

Some 17,000 are expected across three days, and everyone can sign up for a free round of golf thanks to Golf Visions, whose 17 local courses include Foxford Hills, Settler's Hill, and, beginning this spring, Lake Bluff Golf Course.

There's also a raffle for a foursome vacation valued at \$2,400 at show sponsor French Lick Resort, featuring two rooms for a two-night stay, plus rounds on the resort's Donald Ross and Pete Dye courses.

River Forest stalwart lauded by Illinois PGA, topping 2018 awards

he Illinois PGA Section's slate of award winners for 2018 is headed by River Forest Country Club professional Chris Gumbach, the co-founder and co-chair of the Illinois PGA Foundation's Birdies for Charity fundraising program.

Through the leadership of Gumbach and cofounder Travis Johns of Medinah Country Club, the one-day carnival has raised nearly \$1.5 million in just eight years for local children's charities. It's the single longest running fundraiser the Section and Foundation has supported and has made a tremendous impact in the lives of children via several key benefitting charities including the Illinois PGA Foundation, where Gumbach has also served on the board for the past five years and is now an officer.

Gumbach arrived at River Forest, on the edge of Elmhurst, 25 years ago. He grew up in Binghamton, N.Y., a few hours north of New York City, where his father introduced him to the game. After high school graduation, Gumbach decided to pursue a career in the golf business and attended New Mexico State University where he earned a Bachelor of Business Administration degree and majored in marketing as part of the Professional

Golf Management (PGM) program. Following college graduation in 1994, Gumbach returned to Chicago, where he had interned at Itasca Country Club the summer before, to work Terry Russell at River Forest, and he's still there going strong.

"I'm very humbled and honored to be recognized by my peers as the Illinois Section Golf Professional of the Year," Gumbach said. "This is certainly not a solo effort and I have a number of people including my parents, family, friends, members, mentors and fellow golf professionals to thank for their support and encouragement over the years. I really enjoy the game and the camaraderie being involved in all aspects it brings. My passion for the game and the desire to be engaged has been the driving force during my career."

Gumbach, 46, has been deeply involved in Illinois Section leadership since 2007, when he was on the Tournament Committee. He subsequently held numerous positions during the next six years prior to election as the 25th Section President in 2013.

He was named Assistant Professional of the Year in 1999, and is the only current Section professional to have won both awards.

McWilliams has become a well-respected and sought-after teacher and you'll often find him on the course or range during the season or running his Winter Golf Academy and enjoying every minute of it.

Claire Castetter, 24, and Nick Papadakes, 47, work side-by-side at Onwentsia Club in Lake Forest, Ill. and in just a few seasons have developed a solid working relationship that allows them to serve their membership well. Castetter is the winner of the Assistant Professional of the Year Award and Papadakes is honored as the Horton Smith Award winner for his dedication to developing and improving educational opportunities for PGA Professionals.
