Giving thanks for the earth, for food and for each other is an integral part of our daily practice. Through a seasonal cycle of activities in our small garden and throughout the neighborhood, we draw the children's attention to the natural world around them. In winter we have "rain walks" in fall we gather leaves and acorns. We believe a reverence for nature will create the environmentalists of the future.







Our classroom also reflects a reverence for nature. Toys are made of wood, cotton, and other natural materials. Most, like our colored cloths are designed to be used in many different ways. Wooden figures, stones, beeswax and gathered leaves might combine to create an entire village. The stories told by the teachers are in keeping with the changing moods of the year as well as the changing rhythms of each child.
