- Several of our adults attended national gatherings for Women of The ELCA and the Bold Gathering for Men-in-Mission.
- Over 40 people were involved in the joy of learning and faith formation in Vacation Bible School (*Galactic Starveyors!*).
- Sunday School attendance and worship attendance has remained steady (in spite of the excessive heat!).
- Many in the congregation are participating in *Reformers Reading Romans*, the 30-day Bible study developed through the NC Synod.
- In the coming days, we begin the faith-building journey for *This Changes Every-thing!* the National Youth Gathering to be held in Houston, TX in June 2018. My hope is for at least 15 youth and adults to make that journey from St. James.
- Our Men-in-Mission will begin a new program in August, offering a monthly lunchtime Bible study.
- In late August, our congregation council meets in a brief retreat to pray and discuss visions and goals for ministry in 2018.
- We gather weekly around Word and Sacrament to experience God's grace, mercy, and love.

These are only some of the activities through which the Spirit is moving. Each of us have other stories and experiences of daily living where the Spirit encourages, empowers, and enables our faith. Continue to seek out Spirit moments. Continue to grow in this season of Pentecost.



We meet every first Tuesday for a potluck lunch and fellowship.







Property Ministry Update

Hello St. James Family.

A big thanks to all of those who assisted at the July work day!

Around Campus...

Our 1418 Morganton Road property has been on the market for 9 months with seven showings and hundreds of views on the various websites, and two recent Open House events. The offering price was lowered to \$169,900 on July 1st. We were given an offer from a potential buyer, but could not complete the deal so the property remains on the market.

Hurricane/Flooding Repairs.

We made some progress with the Main Building Lower Level repairs last month. We were able to do some additional drywall work as well as tried to grind off the remains floor tile material that remains in the large classroom. Unfortunately this effort was unsuccessful, so we are exploring other options to remove the material. For safety considerations, the lower level remains off limits.

Other news and updates.

We met with a third HVAC subcontractor in the middle of July and received his bid. The property team is preparing a recommendation for the Church Council regarding the HVAC subcontractor. This project includes the heating and cooling solution for the entire space south of the double doors for both the lower and upper levels that includes the following (Sanctuary, Pastor's Robing Room, Women's Parlor, Restroom, Sacristy, Martin Luther Music Room, lower level Classroom, lower level Nursery, Mid-Teen Room, Restrooms in both the blue hallway and green lower level hallway).

The Property Team continues with the "salvage phase" of the 1319 Ft. Bragg Road house, albeit that has taken a back seat to other priority work. We still intend to salvage the baseboards, window and door trim, pine boards in the pine room as well as the hardwood floors. Todd Burns and Chuck Warren remain the points of contact.

We're moving forward with painting the Office/Annex exterior trim, which will provide the building a wonderful visual and structural improvement. The surfaces were scrapped and pressure washed. Next steps include some wood repair and then we'll begin painting.

The Parsonage (1420 Morganton Rd property) experienced a failed capacitor in the upper level unit on July 14th. Our HVAC repair contractor made the repair on Saturday July 15th.


