#### Because we care...

Last winter when a windstorm took down a tree by the playground and obliterated the slide, TICA knew that funds would be needed to replace it. The Thetis Island Community Fund and the Thetis Island Parents Association came in as equal partners with the Thetis Island Community Association to replace it – what a wonderful community in which we live! #### **Work Party**

Thanks to the work of over 30 islanders turning out on a lovely day in May, Forbes Hall had its forest tidied, chipping done to mulch the gardens, patios pressure-washed, windows cleaned, and screens hung. Workers were fed a choice of hot sandwiches, platters of cookies, and their choice of "ales" and "beers". After a very social lunch, they got back at it until all was done – a big thank you to all who turned out!

#### Health Care Services: Nurse Practitioner Contact Update

To make an appointment with the Nurse Practitioner, Erin VanWieren, call her Clinic Office Assistant, Kari, at 250-739-5700 extension 54814 Mondays through Thursdays. Note that there are no walk-in appointments.

However, there are same day appointments on Tuesdays if you have an emerging or urgent medical concern. Call Kari and let her know your issue. If you are unable to contact Kari this way: please call the number of the main clinic which is: 250-739-5784 and someone will be able to help you book an appointment.

For emergencies, continue to call 911.

What are Community Activities at Forbes Hall? They're all sorts of different programs put on by islanders for like-minded friends, neighbours and all islanders, at no charge to participants.



#### Where there's a will, there's a way!

This year there will be a series of informative events provided through grants written and received on behalf of TICA by David Reay. The first event "Dealing with Extreme Heat and Smoke" was in late August with the Cowichan Region's Medical Health Officer, Dr. Shannon Waters, giving an illuminating talk about smoke and heat and how they affect our health. It was an energetic talk with an informative q&a session, and was followed by a hosted lunch. This was through Island Health's community wellness grant and other events will occur through the coming months. One will be about the use of firewood – and how to get efficient, clean heat from your firewood. This series is offered in partnership with ThINC and SPU, more to be announced as the year progresses.

Secondly, through an "Our Cowichan" Small Grant, there will be a series of talks just prior to some Soup's On lunches, while others will be more suited as separate events. These will be from a whole range of topics, all having to do with aspects of health and wellness in our community and will be announced as scheduled. Both of these grants allow for some very specific acquisitions for Forbes Hall: a Bluetooth amplifier to enhance the listening quality for those with hearing aids, including an instructional talk for users; a Purple Air unit to provide air quality information to Thetis Island; and a HEPA filter to create a safe breathing zone within Forbes Hall.

David also successfully worked on two other smaller grants for TICA, Coastal Community Credit Union's sponsorship of Community Day, and a grant from Our Cowichan Communities Health Network for Forbes

Hall Health Services Group's work on the Our Health, Our Community Survey. Thank you, David for taking the initiative to make a difference to islanders' lives! The Purple Air Unit is now installed.

Go online to Purple Air, view Thetis Island on the map, and you'll get the air quality reading from Forbes Hall. Critical on many days due to smoke and other environmental issues.



#### **Forbes Hall Cooling Centre**

Forbes Hall Health Services Group co-ordinated with CVRD's Emergency Support Services to provide Forbes Hall as Thetis' Cooling Centre during the mid-August days of high heat. The Health Group has determined with the CVRD what constitutes opening a Cooling Centre for Thetis Island: when daytime temperatures are forecast to go over 30°C and night temperature does not drop below 20°C for 2 consecutive days. The Thermometer is installed at the Main Fire Hall and is observed regularly during heat warnings. Over the 3-day period more than 50 people accessed the cooling centre. Water and simple snacks were available, and folks spent their time puzzle-making, reading, visiting, and working on their laptops. CVRD Emergency Support funds the opening of the hall for these periods. Plans are being made to develop a similar plan for power-outages and/or extreme cold prior to the winter months. How are the operations of Forbes Hall paid for?

#### Donations:

TICA continues to be a beneficiary of our community's generosity. Since January 2022, TICA has received individual donations of \$101,651, and additionally has had a \$25,000 loan forgiven through the loaner's donation.
