## Some News from the October Vestry Meeting

- The property committee will be applying to the Town of Rothesay Heritage Preservation Board for permission to build a structure over the basement entrance, to divert water and snow. Greg Murdoch has helped the committee produce architectural drawings for the application. If permission is given, quotes to complete the task will be brought to vestry for their approval.
- The property committee is also exploring accessibility to the upper level washrooms. The question of discussion is whether to make the men's or the women's washroom the accessible facility. They are exploring the codes and the options.
- Mission Within is progressing well with the *Come to the Table Supper*, October 25 and the Harvest Dinner, November 1.
- Mission Beyond the Parish is working on the *Sounds for Sigowet Concert*, November 15. Some members attended an information meeting at the YMCA on the Syrian Refugee Crisis. There seem to be a few possible ways we can respond. We can become involved with sponsorships, or partner with others on a direct sponsorship, or make funds available to agencies. Let us be in prayer for how we can lend our support to this need.
- Notice was given of the serious health crisis of little Colin Ranson, two year old son of Rev. Paul Ranson (chaplain at RNS) and Kimberly Ranson. Colin has a rare medical condition that is going to require surgery in the USA. The costs involved are estimated at \$200,000. The level of Provincial Medical financial support has not been determined. We are expecting the Diocese to launch an appeal within the coming weeks and will keep the parish informed as to how we can support this young family.
- The financial reports to the end of October were reviewed and accepted.
