A Note on Lent

Lent is the forty-day season (not counting Sundays) of reflection and preparation for the death and resurrection of Jesus. It is a time of repentance, of considering Christ's sufferings and rethinking how we are called to take up our own crosses. Some people give up things like chocolate, wine, FaceBook or television during this season as sort of fasting. Others try to integrate something new into their lives, like visiting those who do not get many visitors, exercising, praying, study or worship. It is a good season to rethink how we live and to let some things go, or maybe to develop some new holy habits. Lent began on Ash Wednesday with a special liturgy of penitence. But it is not too late to begin your Lenten intentions.

Parish Annual General Meeting – Sunday, February 21

If you have not been to a *Parish Annual Meeting* you might be wondering what it is all about. The most helpful thing to consider is to read the Annual Report booklet, which is available this morning. In this booklet you will find reports of all the activities and ministries of St. Paul's. You will also find financial reports of our offerings and expenditures for 2015 and the Budget for 2016. These reports are all reviewed and received at the meeting. A second important aspect of the meeting is the election of our parish officers: the two wardens; the parish vestry (the official board of the church); and our delegates to the Synod of the Diocese. Synod is the governing body of the church in the Diocese. Every Anglican parish elects delegates to Synod to participate in the wider ministry of the church. The Diocesan Synod elects delegates to represent our Diocese at the national level (General Synod) and the regional level (Provincial Synod, which is Quebec and the Atlantic provinces). One item that parishioners have asked us to discuss is the summer service schedule. Should we go to one service during July and August, and what time should that be? The meeting will be held after the 10 am service next Sunday. *Mission Within* will be preparing a light lunch before the meeting. Everyone is encouraged to attend and learn more about the mission of our parish and discover ways that you can contribute to our common life. See you at the meeting!
