Notes from the April Meeting of Vestry

- The proposal to build an overhang porch above the side basement entrance to the parish hall, has received the approval of the Rothesay Heritage Preservation Board. We have found that during heavy rain storms, water enters the basement area. A tender has been awarded and the work should begin very shortly. Don Crawford and his family have approached Vestry, desiring to fund this project as a memorial to Helen. The Vestry is most appreciative of the Crawford family's generosity and accept their offer with sincere gratitude. The cost of the project will likely be in the \$12,000 range.
- The property committee is also working on a number of projects: handicapped washroom capacity; the freshening up of the Narthex; the sound system; and the church front doors.
- After considerable discussion and consultation with parishioners, the Vestry has decided to maintain the schedule of both the 8 a.m. and 10 a.m. services through the summer months of July and August. We have been able to cover both services with priests during the holiday period and feel that this is the best decision for the life of the parish.
- Greg Fleet did research on the use of FaceBook. 62% of parishes use this method of social media. Vestry agreed to the steps to implement this method of communication. Greg also noted that with changes to our phone system there will be a savings of \$800 in 2016.
- Mission Beyond the Parish hosted the *Ladies' Luncheon* on April 16, with a fascinating presentation by Sandy Thorne on her family connection with the *Titanic.* \$275 was given, to be forwarded to the Saint John High scholarship fund. Approximately 60 people attended the coffee hour between the 8 and 10 a.m. services, enjoying a pleasant morning break together. An inventory of service books was completed. A basket of cushions will be placed in the Narthex. Bishop Edwards will speak at the Men's Breakfast on May 28.
- The Mission Beyond are looking ahead to the annual Yard Sale, May 13 & 14. Help is needed! Please consider signing up to lend a hand.
- The Rector and Wardens are having discussions with the Bishop and with AST regarding the appointment of a youth minister.
- Greetings will be sent from the Parish to Paul & Elizabeth Kitchen upon their retirement from *RNS*.
- Ann Bishop will head up a closing barbecue for the Sunday School, most likely on May 29. Various vestry members agreed to flip burgers.
- Pam lype, Peter Irish, Lea Lord, Bruce Cook and the Rector attended a
 meeting called by Archdeacon Marsh to enhance our relationship with fellow
 Anglicans in the Deanery. They hope to hold a "getting to know you" event either
 in the spring or fall.
- Stephen Palmer, chair of the Finance Committee reported that offerings and expenses are all close to budget for the first quarter of the year. Of particular note was the decline in electrical bills. Vestry expressed its gratitude to all parishioners for their faithfulness in their offerings to God for the ministry of the church.
