Note from Charles and Marilyn

Part 2 of Charles and Marilyn's tour of Newfoundland with the North Lakeshore Chorus of Ontario.

July 7th was spent on the Road to the Isles with our first stop at the Beothuk Centre in Boyd's Cove.. The Beothuk people were the first indigenous people to come into contact with Europeans which set the stage for their eventual extinction - a truly tragic story. At the request of the staff at the Centre, we gave an impromptu concert. Then up to Twillingate where we gave a well attended and received concert at St Peter's Anglican Church built in 1844. We had the afternoon to explore this lovely area. Friday was spent driving from Gander to Rocky Harbor with a stop in Grand Falls/Windsor for a mini sing at the War Memorial. Much to our surprise there were over 25 people there to hear us and we had not expected anyone!! Saturday was a "free day" and most of us took the Western Brook Pond Tour in Gros Morne. It was one of the highlights of our trip, with warm weather and water like glass, the scenery was spectacular. On Sunday we toured the Tablelands Mountains and Discovery Centre in Woody Point and then prepared for our evening concert at St Pat's Church in Woody Point as part of the Gros Morne Summer Music Festival. What a beautiful location for a concert - a Church overlooking Bonne Bay - quite idyllic. On Monday we headed north along the shores of the Viking Trail to St. Anthony with stops along the way at The Arches and Port aux Choix where again we performed mini sings. Our full concert that evening was at St Mary the Virgin Anglican Church. The audience was thrilled to have us there as many remarked that there are never concerts in St Anthony since they are so far away.. Tuesday we spent touring L'Anse aux Meadows UNESCO World Heritage Site and Norstead where we gave a 30 minute concert outside overlooking the ocean and icebergs!! We spent our last day, July 13th, driving from St Anthony's to Corner Brook and that evening gave our final concert at The Anglican Cathedral of St John the Evangelist. The Cathedral was full to capacity and the crowd so enthusiastic and appreciative - the perfect end to a wonderful trip.
