#### **Canadians Remember**

Today marks the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the beginning of the Battle of Vimy Ridge. The assault, which was part of a wider battle of Arras began at 5:30 am on Easter Monday, April 9, 2017. It was the first time that all four divisions of the Canadian Corps fought together. 10,602 soldiers were wounded, and 3,598 died. Our Parish memorial to the Great War, lists the names of 65 men and 9 (presumably) nursing sisters from Rothesay. One wonders how many of them were present at this dreadful battle? Twelve of the 65 would never return home, including the only son of the Rector of St. Paul's, Reginald Daniel. We honour their memory with our gratitude and prayers.


