Godspeed and love to them always ... it is with sadness that we report the passing of the **Ven. Lyman Harding**. Lyman served as a Priest in our diocese beginning in 1964. He served in the parishes of Bright, Madawaska, St. Stephen, Woodstock, Kingston and Saint John. He was Archdeacon of Saint John from 1990 – 1999. In 1994 he published *Citizens With the Saints, A Brief History of Anglicanism in New Brunswick*, as a diocesan sesquicentennial project. He and his wife Margaret returned to his native Ontario after retirement. Archdeacon Harding's funeral will be held Wednesday, June 21 at St. John's Anglican Church, Peterborough ... there is an ordination this afternoon at 4 pm at the Cathedral in Fredericton. Three Deacons will become Priests: **Kevin McAllister, Dan McMullen and David Peer** (brother of Kim Daigle). The Bishop will also be making two deacons: **John Galbraith and Dwight Stuart**. We remember them in our prayers ... our best wishes to **Emily Lemesurier** (daughter of Andrew and Linda) and **Michael Lardner**, who will be married (by Canon Albert) at All Saints Church, St. Andrew's June 24 ... there have been a few party gatherings this past week. Jonathan Young Memorial Amphitheatre

Jonathan was a happy, seemingly healthy boy until the onset of severe headaches in the summer of 2013. Worsening symptoms led to a diagnosis two weeks later: Medulloblastoma-a brain tumor. Despite surgery, radiation and chemotherapy, he died 14 months later. He was 11 years old and attended Rothesay Park School on the Rothesay Common. Jonathan loved singing , dancing, drama and summer camp. He spent time at Camp Medley where a fundraising campaign is underway to build an outdoor amphitheatre so that kids for many years will be able to sing, dance, perform skits, have campfires and enjoy the summer camp experience just as Jonathan did.
