## European Tour

From June 27 to July 12th **Marilyn Duplacey** and **Charles Willett** will be in Europe as members of the North Lakeshore Chorus, marking the 100th Anniversary of the end of the Great War. The choir is travelling on a 16 day performing tour to the United Kingdom, Belgium, France and Germany honouring those who answered the call of King and Country, by singing at many WW1 Memorials and Cemeteries including: Vimy Ridge on Canada Day; Beaumont Hamel, the Dominion of Newfoundland's Memorial to the horrendous losses suffered by the Royal Newfoundland Regiment on July 1st, 1916, as part of the launch of the Battle of Somme; Menin Gate(dedicated to the British and Commonwealth soldiers killed in the Ypes Salient of WW1 and whose graves are unknown) Ploegsteert(scene of the 1914 Christmas Truce); Essex Farm (where Lt. Col John McCrae penned "In Flanders Fields); Tyne Cot Cemetery (the largest Commonwealth cemetery); Cologne South Commonwealth Cemetery and the Scottish National War Memorial (tribute to the Royal Newfoundland Regiment.
