BURIED WITH CHRIST, REBORN BY THE HOLY SPIRIT



"We thank you, Father, for the water of Baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Therefore in joyful obedience to your Son, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. [BCP, 306-307]

Death – resurrection – rebirth – From the very earliest years of the fledgling Christian faith, baptism and Easter were rightly linked. Christian Baptism has no meaning apart from the resurrection. And so it is not only a lovely gesture but also most fitting that we will have two baptisms on Easter morning! I can think of no better time than Easter to remember that the ones being baptized are being immersed in the death and resurrection of Christ.

For that matter, perhaps Lent, especially during Holy Week, and then Easter, are about *our own* dying and rising. In our liturgy, week to week, but perhaps most powerfully during Holy Week and then Easter, we reenact the events of Christ's death and resurrection so that we can remember that we, too, have been born again and are now, forever, sustained by the living presence of Jesus Christ in his body and blood and in the faces of all his people. And so the baptisms of Ayden Mullen and Nathan Reynolds provide an opportunity for each of us to deepen our understanding of baptism and add to our Easter joy.

So come, gather around these two families as their children gain entry into our large family! Each of us will not only witness this baptism, but we will also remember, celebrate, and renew our own baptisms as we join in saying the Baptismal Covenant together. To put it in even more profound terms, Easter is foremost about Jesus dying and rising again – but it's also about each of *us* dying and rising, each of *us* being born again by water and Spirit, "sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked as Christ's own forever."

Have a blessed Easter, and I pray that through the remainder of Lent and the joy of Easter, the amazement of God's love for you deepens and shows itself in new and creative ways.


- -A doll pram or stroller

Bringing LIFE to Your Kitchen!

Ingredients and supplies:

- 1 cup almonds (or pecans)
- 1 tsp. vinegar
- 3 egg whites
- Pinch of salt

- 1 cup sugar
- Zipper baggy
- Wooden spoon
- Mixing bowl
- Mixer

- Cookie sheet
- Spoons
- Tape
- Bible
- 1) PREHEAT OVEN TO 300 DEGREES. Place one cup nuts into a baggy. Beat the nuts with a wooden spoon until broken into tiny pieces. Remind children Jesus was beaten by the Roman Soldiers. **Read John 19:1-3 and Isaiah 53:5**
- 2) Allow each child to smell the vinegar. Pour a small amount into a bowl and allow them to taste it. Explain that vinegar was given to Jesus to drink when he was on the cross. Add 1 tsp. vinegar into a mixing bowl. **Read John 19:28-30**
- 3) Add egg whites to vinegar. The eggs in this recipe represent life. They remind us that Jesus gave his life to give us life abundantly. **Read John 10:10-11**
- 4) Put a pinch of salt in your child's hand. Allow them to taste it. Add a pinch of salt to the eggs and vinegar. The salt represents the salty tears cried by the women who followed Jesus. **Read Luke 23:27.**
- 5) Place a pinch of sugar in your child's hand. Allow them to taste it. Add one cup sugar to the mixture. Up to this point, the ingredients have been very bitter, but the sweetness in the recipe comes from the sugar. The suffering and death of Jesus are bitter, but the sweetness is that Jesus died because He loves us. **Read Psalm 34:8 and John 3:16**
- 6) Beat the mixture for 12-15 minutes until stiff peaks are formed (I recommend setting a timer -- it's important to beat the mixture well). The whiteness of the mixture reminds us of purity and the cleansing of our sins because of Jesus' death. **Read Isaiah 1:18**
- 7) Stir in the nuts. Drop spoonsfull of dough onto a cookie sheet. The mounds represent the tomb where Jesus was buried. **Read Matthew 27:57-60**
- 8) After the oven is preheated, put the cookie sheets in the oven. TURN OFF the oven. Allow your child to place pieces of tape and "seal" the oven door. Jesus' tomb was sealed with a large rock. Read Matthew 27:59
- 9) Leave the cookies in the oven overnight. Your child might feel sad to leave the cookies in the oven overnight. Jesus' followers were very sad when the tomb was sealed. **Read John 16:20-22**
- 10) In the morning, open the oven and have some cookies! Surprise!! The cookies should be hollow inside. Remind your child that the tomb was empty. Jesus is risen! **Read Matthew 28:1-9**

Cross-Making for Lent

This Saturday, April 12, please join us in the Activity Room for a simple breakfast (coffee, bagels and toppings, eggs) and a Lenten craft and prayer activity for ALL AGES. We will be making crosses as preparation for our journey in Holy Week, and the variety of crosses that can be made is infinite.

Making crosses doesn't involve reading, studying, or discussions, like many Lenten programs. It's a more physical approach to God. The author of *Making Crosses: A Creative Connection to God*, calls it "kinetic prayer" – it helps us to an "understanding that does not come from parsing out an explanation for God, but arrives through a sensory, interactive experience of God."

Mother Sandra will offer minimal guidance and a prayer framework, but the artwork will be your own. You can bring "found objects" that are meaningful to you to incorporate into your crosses; and you can always add more later, since there's no need for projects to be completed if you want to continue working on them on your own. 
