A Message from Andrew C. Ely, Rector's Warden

One hundred twenty five years is a long time. Not one of us can remember back that far. Yet however old we sometimes feel we are still not 125!

The Vestry met on Wednesday, October 15 and 11 vestry members were present. Mother Sandra still recuperating from surgery was not present. Fr. Geoff West was also missing. The following non-vestry members also attended the meeting: Carol Harrity, Beville Jones, Susan Dean, Nick Durante, and Nina Schrock. Andrew Ely, Rector's Warden, chaired the meeting. The minutes and financial reports were approved as submitted by Joanne Heisler, Nelson Schrock, and Adrian Griffin.

- A part has been ordered to fix the leak in the men's basement bathroom.
- Andrew provided a statement that he had prepared indicating the Diocese was very happy with the fact that we had revisited our decision to increase the pledge. Beville Jones and Carol Harrity provided statements reflecting their disappointment in how the matter was handled and the fact that there was no communication with them regarding the fact that the money was withdrawn out of the account. Nick Durante expressed disappointment with the way the manner was handled. The Vestry members discussed the topic furthermore and the primary problem seems to be lack of communication regarding the issue. Recommendation that a formal apology letter will be written and sent to the Youth Group Custodians. Discussion was made regarding how the minutes should be communicated in the future. There was some discussion on some ideas to invigorate some of the Youth Group activities with other churches.
- Joanne Heisler provided a quick update of the plans for the 125th Anniversary.
- The Carpet Campaign to carpet the sanctuary is getting close to the target amount of \$4,400.
- The church audit for 2013 is still outstanding.
- The church copier seems to be on its last legs. Currently researching lease options for a new copier.
- With the departure of Viola Van Der Meulen, there will be four vestry slots that will need to be filled next year.
- There is a problem with the church microphones. Andrew is going to contact Jay Petel to determine what needs to be done to try and resolve the problem.
- Liz Parker mentioned, moving the Advent breakfast to December 7 because the usual weekend would be Thanksgiving weekend.

The Meeting adjourned at 8:30 p.m. and the next meeting will be held Wednesday, November 19 at 6:30 p.m.

Best Episcopal Pie

Lorene's Apple Pie Kate Petel, All Saints' Episcopal Church



Pie recipe:

1 unbaked pie shell - either purchased or made from your favorite recipe Peel and core five large golden delicious apples and two gala apples Slice about 1/4" thick and layer 1/2 in pie shell. Sprinkle with 1/4 tsp cinnamon, and nutmeg with 1/4 c sugar Add remaining apples. Sprinkle with another 1/4 tsp cinnamon and nutmeg but no sugar.

Topping: 1 stick softened butter 1/2 c unbleached flour 1/2 c uncooked oats 1/2 c brown sugar 1/4 c white sugar

Combine dry ingredients. Work in softened butter until crumbly. Top on apples. Put in middle of preheated oven. Bake at 325 degree oven for 50-60 minutes until topping is browned.



Best All Youth Pie

Tropical Pie Julia Windbiel, All Saints' Episcopal Church

2 pie tins
pie crust for two pies with tops
one large pineapple
4 ripe mangos
1 jar of mango/apricot preserves
1/2 stick of butter
1 egg for brushing crust and adhering the edges

Cut pineapple and mangos into small pieces. Melt butter. Mix butter, fruit and preserves together in bowl and let sit (overnight in fridge works great!). Roll out crusts and line pie tins, pierce crusts and bake (empty) at 350 degrees for 10 minutes. Cool. Pour fruit mixture in crusts and top with crust. Brush with egg.

Bake at 375 degrees for about 60 minutes, or until the crust is brown (Cover edges with aluminum foil to prevent burning.).



Best Pie in the West End Apple Cheddar Pecan Sugar Tart *Nancy Foster, Christ Church United Church of Christ*

1 pouch (1 lb., 1.5 oz.) Betty Crocker sugar cookie mix
1 t apple pie spice
1/2 c cold butter or margarine, cut into pieces
3/4 c chopped pecans
1/2 c finely shredded Cheddar cheese
1 egg white
1 can (21 oz.) apple pie filling with more fruit

Directions:

Heat oven to 350 degrees. Place cookie sheet in oven. Spray 10 inch tart pan with removable bottom with cooking spray. In large bowl, stir cookie mix with apple pie spice until blended. Cut in butter using pastry blender or fork until mixture is crumbly. Reserve 1 cup of the crumb mixture in a small bowl, stir in pecans and cheese.

To crumb mixture in large bowl, stir in egg white until soft dough forms. Press dough in bottom and up sides of pan.

Place apple pie filling in medium bowl. Using knife, cut apples into small pieces. Spoon apple mixture evenly over cookie dough crust. Sprinkle reserve crumb mixture over apples.

Place tart on cookie sheet in oven. Bake 40 to 50 minutes or until edges are golden brown and topping is set. Cool completely, about one hour. To serve, remove sides of pan, cut into wedges. Store covered at room temperature. Serves 16
