Rector's Reflections

In my September 2011 Rector's Reflections, I wrote: "As September rolls around, I realize that I've never felt so grateful to have cold toes!"

Cold toes? Sounds impossible - as I write, the hot weather has let up just a tiny bit, but cold toes seem far, far away.

Chilly days or not, autumn is upon us – we unpack our bags, put away our summer clothes, and return to our regular routine. This year was a little different, though: we had a <u>lot</u> going on all summer! On page 8 you can read about work projects done – maintenance, improvements, repairs. I'm sure you've noticed the resurfaced parking lot if you've been here, with sparkling new lines, but that's just the tip of the iceberg:

- Gardens and grounds were lovingly tended on hot, hot days;
- Church Administrator Extraordinaire, Donna, organized a work day up in the office and computer lab (see page 3);

• the Second Time Around Shop got much-needed repainting and carpet cleaning just in time for the shop crew to reshelve and organize for reopening in the fall. (And there's a <u>Second Time</u> <u>Around "open house"</u> during the Homecoming Picnic.)

<u>Consider the practice of sabbath-keeping</u>: As fall settles in and we return to our regular schedules, it's good to remember that the spiritual discipline of sabbath keeping is God's <u>gift</u> to humanity – not an extra legalistic burden. At its core, Sabbath was provided by God from the very first as a way of <u>pausing</u>, taking a breath, resting, relaxing, spending time with loved ones, as well as religious observance – worship, prayer, even walking in nature while thanking God for the gifts of creation.

Our 24/7 culture doesn't encourage or even support Sabbath practice, and it isn't always possible to declare one particular day as a day of rest – but my hope and prayer for all of us is that we find regular time to pause, reconnect with God, spend time with the ones we love, and refresh ourselves so that we can return to our busy lives with energy, gratitude, and even a sense of God's presence throughout the rest of the week.

Preparing for the Fall season for Children, Family, and Youth Events



If you are 18 years or older and plan to volunteer in direct contact with children and youth on a regular basis (Example: Sunday school teacher/assistant, youth group advisor/helper, and nursery attendant) clearances are now required due to Pennsylvania's Act 153. Contact Donna in the office so she can share the appropriate websites and paperwork with you to begin the process of getting your child-abuse and criminal background checks. Clearances are valid for 2-3 years. If you have already had clearances done previously for All Saints, we'll contact you if they have expired and will need

to be renewed. If we fail to comply with the Act, we could be fined up to \$2,500. Religious organizations are no longer exempt and are required to follow the new regulations.

The Diocese also encourages our volunteers and church leaders to complete online Safe Church training. If you do not have access to a computer, you are welcome to use the computers in the church's computer lab. Contact Mother Sandra for the link and contact Donna in the office to make arrangements for access to the computer lab.

Let's work together and make All Saints a place well-known to be steadfast, caring and SAFE.

Convention begins Friday evening, November 4, at 6:30 p.m. and continues on Saturday, November 5, 2016, beginning at 7:30 a.m. at the Philadelphia Episcopal Cathedral. Friday's program begins with a 6:30 Eucharist with our



new Bishop followed by a reception. On Saturday, registration begins at 7:30 a.m., with music and Morning Prayer beginning at 8:15 a.m. Delegates representing All Saints Cy Burke, Sarah Callow, and Donna Penman will accompany clergy to the convention. This year's theme will focus on "Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God—what is good and acceptable and perfect" (Romans 12:2).

The Diocese invites all members of the Diocese to attend any of the upcoming pre-convention meetings, and encourages Convention representatives to participate in the gatherings to share in-depth presentations on the proposed 2017 program budget and proposed resolutions to be voted on at the convention in November.

Legacy, Remembrance, Glory

The Rt. Rev. Edmond Lee Browning (pictured left), the 24th Presiding Bishop of <u>The Episcopal Church</u>, died on July 11, 2016. He was 87 years old and was living in Oregon.

Bishop Browning served as Presiding Bishop of The Episcopal Church 1986-1997. Bishop Browning's election as Presiding Bishop in 1986 was seen as a reflection of the Church's broadening diversity due to his extensive international and multicultural experience.

Bishop Browning hoped to encourage a growing awareness of diversity in the Church. He was well-known for his quote, "no outcasts in the church."

"The Episcopal Church is faithfully seeking to truly become 'a house of prayer for all people,' as Jesus said quoting the Hebrew prophets, and that is greatly the case because Presiding Bishop Browning taught us that the church must be a place where there are no outcasts," commented the Most Rev. Michael B. Curry, the 27th Presiding Bishop. "That enduring legacy is still helping to set many a captive free. It is evidence that God is not finished with us yet, for every once in awhile spiritual giants still walk among us as living reminders. And one of those reminders was Edmund Lee Browning, 24th Presiding Bishop and Primate of the Episcopal Church. Well done, good and faithful servant. May you rest in peace and rise in glory."

Summertime is a busy time of the year and we all have plenty to do at our own homes. The work around the Church doesn't go away when we're busy, it often just doesn't get done. We're very fortunate to have a core group of volunteers who give their time as they can.



We were even blessed with a volunteer, Travis, who has attended just one Sunday service and came out to help (I hope he still likes us!). The work we had to do that night was to replace windows in the basement of the Rectory with Plexiglas and to unstick all the windows so we could remove the storm windows prior to painting. A little explanation may help you to understand that we thought for sure that the windows were stuck for at least 50 years and that the storm windows hadn't been moved in at least that many years. Most of the windows required four hands just to budge them. We even thought maybe a gallon of petroleum jelly might help or some WD40. All this

on a 90-degree night. You know the old saying that the family that plays together stays together.....well how about changing it to the church family that sweats and laughs together stays together!

This summer we tackled the following projects:

- Replaced ceiling tiles and light covers.
- Repaired light switches in two bathrooms.

- Installed two new Sunday-only handicapped signs and one permanent one.

Coming up is shoring up the fence, sanding walls in the lobby, and painting bookcases and maybe a wall in Mother Sandra's office.

EPISCOPAL 101 with Mother Sandra: Bishop Daniel Gutierrez will be making a visitation on Sunday, October 30, and will be available for confirmation or reception. *Confirmation* is for baptized Christians who wish to make "a mature public affirmation of their faith and commitment to the responsibilities of their Baptism" – for youth or adults 12 years or older. *Reception* is for anyone who has "received the laying-on of hands at Confirmation by a Bishop in apostolic succession" (which includes Roman Catholic, Eastern Orthodox, Anglican churches worldwide, and Evangelical Lutheran Church of America, among others). We'll learn what it means to live out our Baptismal vows, as well as some background about the Episcopal Church such as why and how we worship, and a look at the Bible and the Book of Common Prayer. <u>Episcopal 101 is preparation for confirmation, reception, or just as a "refresher course" for anyone interested</u>. Please sign up in the vestibule if you are interested. Classes will be held after church from mid-September until October 30.
