

### Summer is Here! [Now What?]

Are you ready for summer? I am! Don't forget to include All Saints in your summer plans. With warmer days and the slower pace, opportunities for fun and fellowship abound:

- Pentecost June 4 We'll have one service for Pentecost. Come and join us for a celebration which will include special music. We remember the coming of the Holy Spirit in full force, and the Jesus Movement that arose powerfully after Easter.
- Father's Day June 18 Bring Dad to church... or hold your fathers in special memory, recalling how the guidance and faith of our fathers guided and upheld us.

Read a good book! There are lots of opportunities:

- <u>Summer reading book trade</u> Do you have suggestions for perfect beach reading? If you have an extra copy, bring it to church and swap it for someone else's. Be sure to indicate if you want the book back or not. Look for the "display" in the narthex.

Watch a movie or two!

- If you haven't watched any movies at church recently, you're in for a surprise!

  Nina and Andrew Ely organized a few "film festivals" and were able to turn our Activity Room into a very comfortable and effective movie theater. The sound goes through the sound system, and with lights out, our nice padded folding chairs, and plenty of popcorn or other snacks, it feels like the real deal.
- June 11 in the Activity Room following worship: Raw Faith, a documentary that follows two years in the life of a Unitarian minister, Marilyn Sewell. "Marilyn must rely on raw faith as she questions her future, her difficult past, her God, and most importantly . . . her ability to love," says IMDB.com (the Internet Movie Data Base).

# All Saints Member acknowledged as Distinguished Teacher



The Philadelphia School District nominated and submitted to the Lindback Foundation, Stacey Dello Buono, as a winning elementary school teacher. Stacey, a teacher at Thomas Mifflin Elementary School, was honored on May 16 at the Prince Music Theater. The Christian R. and Mary S. Lindback Foundation celebrates excellence in education, and has awarded

teaching prizes since 2008.

The following excerpt was submitted on Stacey's behalf: Dello Buono is a strong teacher who has taken it upon herself to

engage the whole school in academic collaboration. She coordinated an oratorical contest, started a career day, runs a book fair and math workshops, and even opened a "museum" to display student projects.





It is with sadness that we announce the death of Martha Ough Briggs on May 12 in Andover, Massachusetts. Martha was the youngest of the three children of The Rev. J. Preston Ough and Sarah Lee Ough. Fr. Ough was Rector of All Saints from 1957 to 1969, when he died. Martha (age 55), suffered heart failure while hiking with her husband in Salt Lake City in November, resulting in irreversible brain damage. She had two children, and was engaged in restoration architecture in New England.

Funeral services for Martha were held at Holy Trinity Episcopal Church in West Chester on May 27 with Robert Betty as organist. Martha was born while the Oughs lived in All Saints' Rectory. Her sister, Sallie (Ough) Nangeroni, lives in Doylestown and her brother, Larry Ough, lives in Atlanta. Sarah Lee (Ough) Houston lives at Crosslands in Kennett Square. The following Wednesday, June 14, is 'pack it up - ship it out' day. We clear out the whole shop and let several organizations be the beneficiaries of our leftover merchandise. These groups include Cradles to Crayons, Impact, Interfaith and our own free clothing distribution to the Saturday night Cafe crowd here at All Saints. Nothing goes to waste and smiles

abound as these groups receive some quality merchandise.

But our jobs are not done. The next big project will be a thorough cleaning—all shelves, all racks, flooring, etc. We do this in preparation for 'resetting' the thrift shop with merchandise for the fall/winter when we open up the first week in September.

On that note – yes, we do accept quality merchandise throughout the summer, and many days will be spent sorting and getting ready for the next season. Some days we are not there and other days the office is closed – so it is best if you clear with the office when you can drop off your 'stuff.' Remember always – please no torn or dirty clothing, those missing buttons and zippers, etc., accepted. Clean and 'good shape' clothing and jewelry always appreciated. Housewares items are in high demand – small appliances, dishware, etc., and small electronics. Chipped, broken, rusted – hmm, no thanks. We are not equipped to sell TV's or computers. Unfortunately, large furniture pieces also will not be accepted. Oh – another big seller – craft items like yarn, knitting needles, etc. Toys for all ages are hot selling items and we continue to need preschool books for the daycare groups that come to visit. Our seniors (and shop workers) all love paperback books and hard cover books. Can't beat our book prices and several of our customers 'stock up' and then return the books when finished. Great way to recycle!

We have grown to a volunteer staff of 10 - Betsy Gottshall, Clara Mae Panczak, Donna Penman, Shirley Jording, Linda Cox, Marcia Carneavale, Jean Dean, Francie Dean, Sue Errington and occasionally Sue Dean. Although we can leave exhausted after a busy Wednesday (some of us also work on Tuesdays) we enjoy the camaraderie and we truly feel we are offering a service to our community. Where else can you get a pair of pants for \$1 and a short-sleeved blouse for \$1.50? Bedding – how does \$4 sound for a set of double sheets? Every dollar earned goes back to All Saints – your donations recycled back as money for your church.

Have a blessed summer and remember – we truly appreciate that you keep us in mind when it is time to downsize or clean out closets.


