Stewardship Sunday: November 12, 2017

"Ask not what All Saints can do for you; ask what you can do for All Saints!" That's the stewardship theme suggested by a parishioner (not John F. Kennedy – a different John F.!).

Talking about stewardship can be awkward; sometimes it feels about like standing on a street corner begging. Asking people to participate in a ministry is similar: it can feel like asking for a personal favor. But neither sentiment is correct. We ask for both so that you can live out your baptismal vows!

So for your enjoyment, entertainment, and edification, here's a "Stewardship Quiz" – like the definition, it doesn't cover everything, but is just food for thought. Ask what you can do for All Saints – and what you can do for God and one another!

Quiz Answers (from page 1)

Answers:

- 1. Christian stewardship includes: <u>all</u> boxes should be checked:
 - The principle of ownership: Psalm 24:1 The earth is the Lord's and all that is in it, the world, and those who live in it.
 - Healthy living: Caring for our bodies is primary in stewardship; none stay as strong as young adults or energetic as young children, but stewardship includes doing our best to care for these God-created and God-given bodies. "Do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you, which you have from God, and that you are not your own?" 1 Corinthians 6:19
 - Skills and talents: "For we are what he has made us, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand to be our way of life." Eph. 2:10
 - Financial support: "For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also."
 - Ecology: "... the land is mine; with me you are but aliens and tenants." (Lev. 25:23); "The land that you are crossing over to occupy is a land of hills and valleys, watered by rain from the sky, and land that the Lord your God looks after. The eyes of the Lord your God are always on it, from the beginning of the year to the end of the year." (Deut. 11:11-12); and "The nations raged, but your wrath has come, and the time for judging the dead, for rewarding your servants, . . . and for destroying those who destroy the earth" (ouch! Rev. 11:18)
- 2. In the Bible, a steward was one who:
 - Ruled over the affairs of the household; the needs of the vulnerable would be considered part of the affairs of a good household.
- 3. The fruits of the Spirit include:
 - Kindness and faithfulness; the others are love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, and self-control. Generosity and responsibility, important elements of stewardship, are a result of living out the fruits given us by the Holy Spirit.
- 4. The primary purpose of a church is:
 - A place where people seek transformation through contact with each other and God. That's what it's all about <u>transformation!</u> Transformed hearts are naturally generous; transformed communities are naturally sources of encouragement, challenge, help, and support; transformed lives are excited and unafraid of using and exhibiting their gifts, knowing that those gifts are from God and can be used for the benefit of all.
- 5. The tithe (10%) is the standard for Christian giving.
 - Maybe. Tithing was clearly expected in the Old Testament. In fact, Abram tithed even before God made a covenant with him and with his offspring. (Genesis 14:18-20)
 - While tithing was mandatory under the Old Covenant, as participants in the New Covenant brought by Jesus Christ we are given freedom. Jesus mentions the tithe, and it was an assumed obligation of converts from Judaism. However, Jesus also stresses that it's what in our hearts that matters; and since the great commandment is to love God with all our hearts, minds, souls, and strength, and to love our neighbors as ourselves, for most of us, that would mean giving more than a tithe, at least when we feel called to do so. Therefore the answer is "maybe" giving 10% is certainly appropriate for Christians, as is giving less (when that's impossible) or giving more (when more appears to be required).

It was fun creating this quiz; hope it provides helpful and interesting information on stewardship as you consider what you can pledge, and how you can continue to give in the upcoming year. Mother Sandra+


