#### **Attention Wimberley Travelers**

#### Attention Houston Travelers

We suggest that you make plans to stay at a Wimberley motel or B&B the night before departure and the night after our return to Wimberley. It will be easier to be on the bus and ready for departure in the morning. We'll be happy to suggest several reasonable overnight accommodations at your request. We'll safely park our vehicles at no extra charge in the Wimberley Brookshire Brothers parking lot which is police-patrolled 24/7 at our request. We've done this for our trips over the past 10 years and have never experienced any problem with this arrangement. You may choose to carpool to Wimberley. However, if you should choose to drive in to Wimberley early on April 3rd, allow yourselves PLENTY of time to arrive from the Houston area. Thursday is a work day and you will need to plan for driving in heavy Houston traffic in the morning to get to Wimberley.





# DAY 1: Thursday, April 3 - Wimberley to Ft. Davis

Leave from Wimberley Brookshire Brothers Parking lot for Ft. Davis State Park. Lunch on your own at the Hitching Post Steak House. Arrive at the historic Indian Lodge Resort, constructed in the 1930s by the Civilian Conservation Corps and featuring the original interiors and furnishings resembling a Southwestern Native-American-style, multilevel pueblo village. Indian Lodge was voted the #1 accommodation in Texas by readers of Texas Highways magazine. Welcome dinner at the Indian Lodge restaurant. Our group will gather for a relaxing get together under the Big Sky this evening.

Visit Chihuahuan Desert Nature Center (a desert botanical garden, 1400 sq. ft. cactus and succulent greenhouse, and interpretive exhibits). McDonald Observatory at night for TWILIGHT and STARGAZING PARTY. Observe the stars through high powered telescopes. Dinner on your own at the StarDate Café at the observatory.

Dinner at Terlingua's famous Starlight Theatre restaurant. Enjoy an after-dinner beer or iced tea or just visit with the locals on The Porch, the heartbeat of the Ghost town. # DAY 4 : Sunday, April 6 Lajitas to Big Bend National Park

Breakfast at the hotel. Visit the Barton Warnock Environmental Center for an introduction to the history, geology, flora and fauna of the region. Then on to Terlingua for a tour of the town's graveyard and mining ruins. Lunch in Study Butte and then on to Big Bend National Park visitor center in the Chisos Mountain Basin. While there, browse the store, go to The Window overlook for photo opportunities and take a short trail for viewing the vistas of the park. We will then proceed to the Chisos Mountain Lodge the only lodge inside Big Bend National Park for check in. Dinner at the Chisos Mountain Lodge. Evening free under the stars. NOTE: Big Bend is one the most unique environments for those who love birding.


















## DAY 7: Wednesday, April 9 Alpine to Wimberley
