What is the Midcoast Community Council?

The Midcoast Community Council was ratified November 8, 1991. A General Election was held, and voters were in favor of forming the Midcoast Community Council which included the election of 7 local residents to Council Seats. The Council's main purpose is to increase representation for the communities of Princeton, El Granada, Moss Beach, Montara and Miramar to the County Government in Redwood City.

The Midcoast Community Council holds regular meetings the second and fourth Wednesdays of each month, 7:00 pm at the El Granada School Multi Purpose Room.
