Featured grant

A \$5,000 grant for El Camino Music Program resulted in an exciting collaborative high school experience for students, who worked with accomplished professional Los Angeles composer Anthony O'Toole to create a commissioned musical arrangement that they performed in the new El Camino Performing Arts Center. O'Toole came to the school to meet students, hear them play, and solicit their ideas for what they wanted in the music, returning twice with a draft that students critiqued and revised. The students also communicated with the composer via email and Dropbox.

"This was an amazing learning experience and collaboration with the composer. Anthony O'Toole is an accomplished published composer. He is young, so there was a nice connection with the kids. Most commissioned works would cost considerably more, but Tony was willing to work with us for the cause."
