

Summer Playgroup Format:

- Your child will be assigned to a “home-base” classroom that may or may not be the same room that your child had during the school year.
- It is important to remember that the Summer Camp program is a variance on the routine that was experienced by your child during the school year. It is likely that your child will be with different children and teachers in his/her home-base than those that were in his/her classroom during the school year. On the other hand, children will share the outdoor times together during the major portion of the day.

Medical Forms:

- If the school does not have a current immunization record on file, please bring an updated copy of your child’s immunization record to the school office on or before your child’s first day of summer camp.

Daily Arrival Time:

- 9:00 a.m. – 9:10 a.m., Monday – Friday.
- Please **PARK and DELIVER** your child to his/her “home-base” classroom each day. Home-bases will be posted on the first day of each session at both the office and portable entrances.
- If you arrive prior to 9:00 a.m. you may take your child to our fenced side yard and remain with them until 9:00. At that time, the teachers will greet your child in the home-base classroom.
- Please know that home-bases are brief classroom1 experiences each day. The majority of the camp experience takes place outside with friends together in a large group! The exception will be with the younger 3’s group, and they will alternate playground times with the older group.

Dismissal:

- 1:00 p.m. Monday – Friday.
- There is a late pick up charge of \$1.00 per minute for any child picked up after 1:10 p.m.
- Dismissal will be from the school parking lot as it is during the school year. The teachers will help your child into the car.
- If you are in a carpool, please present a written note to the teachers in your child’s home-base. **As always, your child will not be permitted to go home with another child without a written note, or a call to the office.**

Dress:

- Plan to dress your child in a swim suit with a T-shirt or “easy-to-dress” loose clothing as a cover-up.
- Shoes that are rubber soled are appropriate as well as aqua shoes and/or Velcro-strapped rubber sandals that can get wet. **Boots are not allowed.**
- Bring a labeled towel each day and plan for your child to bring a wet towel home each day.

Lunch:

- Send a water bottle. We will carry them to the playground daily.
- Please remember to pack a healthy lunch and drink every day. (No carbonated drinks)
- As a reminder, we have children registered for SAC who have allergies to nut products. In keeping with our promise to serve and protect our children, we ask that lunches be **NUT FREE**. We suggest an alternative to peanut butter is sun butter which can be found at most grocery stores.

Toilet Training:

- If your three year old child is not completely toilet trained, he/she must wear “swim diapers” in order to attend. We encourage you to bring the new and improved version of swim diapers that are proving to be more effective and address health concerns in group settings.
- All other children must be independent in their bathroom needs.

Remember:

- If your child is not to go home in the usual way, please send a note to that effect and see that it goes to his/her home-base teacher. We will not accept a child’s or a friend’s verbal message.
- If you have any pressing information regarding your child, please call the school office at 476-4393. The school office will be staffed Monday – Friday from 8:30 a.m. – 1:30 p.m.
