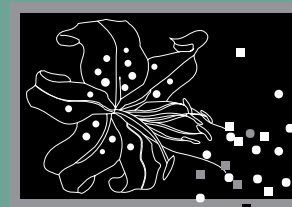

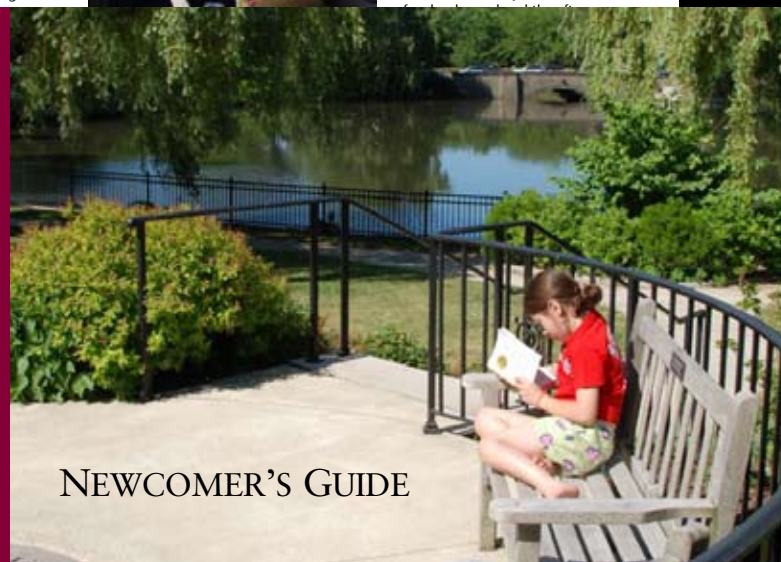

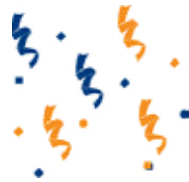

From Boston/Points North:

Route 3/93 South to Route 128. Take first exit, Exit #6 (Route 37). Bear left at end of the ramp. Turn left onto Granite Street (Route 37). At first set of lights (Herb Chambers Ford), turn left onto Woodbury Road. F1 is approximately 3/4 mile on the left.

From North/West:

Route 128 South to where it becomes 93 South (at Exit 12 exit. Continue ahead on 93 South and take Exit #6 (Route left at the end of the ramp. Turn left onto Granite Street (R at first set of lights (Herb Chambers Ford), turn left onto W F1 is approximately 3/4 mile on the left.

From Worcester/Points West:

Mass Turnpike (Route 90) East to Exit #14, Route 128/95 South to Exit #6 (Route 37). Bear left onto Granite Street (Route 37). At first intersection (Herb Chambers Ford), turn left onto Wood Road. F1 is approximately 3/4 mile on the left.

Route 95 North to Route 128 South; 93 North to Exit #6 (Bear left at end of the ramp. Turn left onto Granite Street (F1 is approximately 3/4 mile on the left.

From Cape Cod/Points Southeast:

Route 3 North to Route 128 North/93 South to Exit #6 (Ro Bear left at end of the ramp. Turn left onto Granite Street (At first set of lights (Herb Chambers Ford), turn left onto W F1 is approximately 3/4 mile on the left.

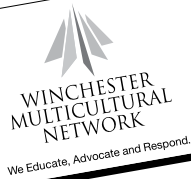

RECREATION AND ARTS

The **Winchester Recreation Department** at 263 Main Street, (www.winrec.com) offers many helpful services to the Winchester Community, including after school care for children, adult education, swimming lessons, tennis memberships to the Packard Tennis Courts, and Peer Leaders for Middle School Students.

The **Young Men's Christian Association (YMCA)** in Woburn at 137 Lexington St. offers a wide variety of activities and has indoor swimming for toddlers, children and adults.

The **Middlesex Fells** (www.fells.org) is a large community park that lies on the border between Winchester, Medford, Melrose, and Stoneham. It offers many activities throughout the year, including hikes and mountain biking. The Fells has many paths that are open to the public from dawn till dusk throughout the year. A map of the Fells can be obtained at Book Ends, 559 Main St., Winchester or other places listed on the Fells website.

Horn Pond (www.woburnmaps.com/hornpond/index.htm) offers walking paths and fishing in the neighboring town of Woburn. This pond lies very close to the Woburn-Winchester Border and can be easily accessed from Lake St, off Main St.

The **Griffin Museum of Photography** (www.griffinmuseum.org) dedicated to the art of photography, is located at 67 Shore Road (781-729-1158). The museum offers exhibitions, programs, and lectures.

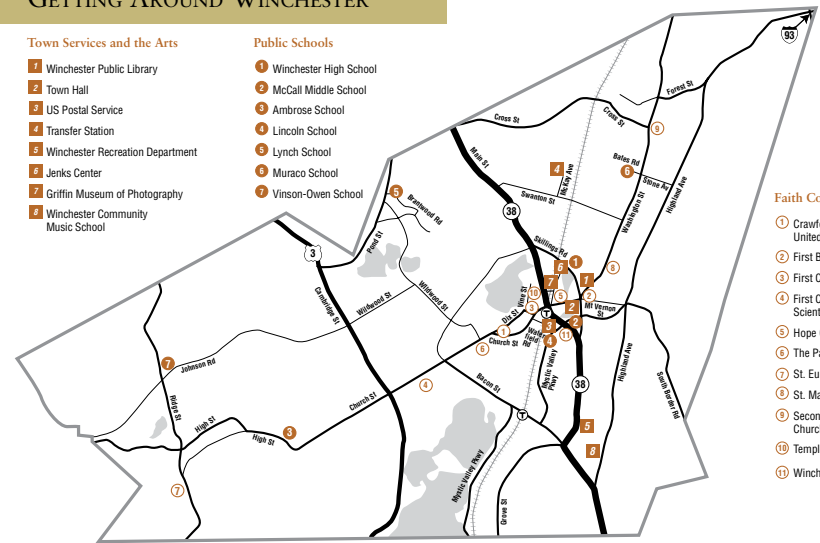

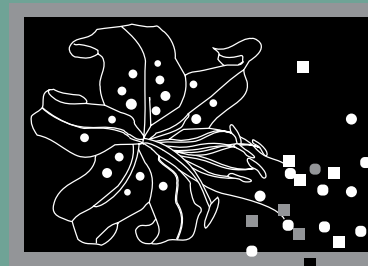
