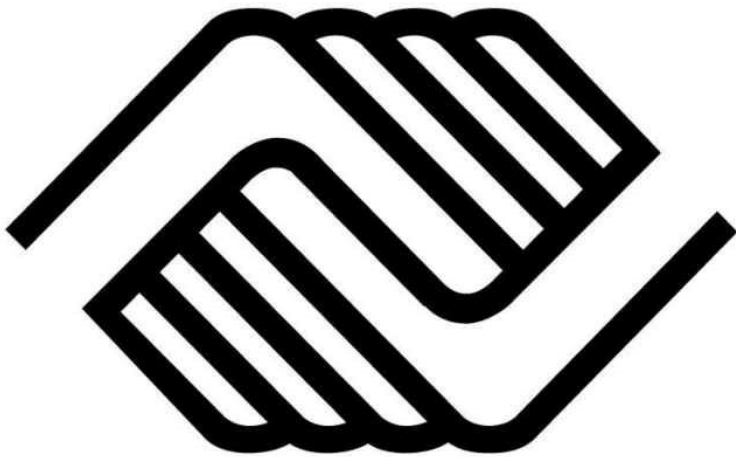

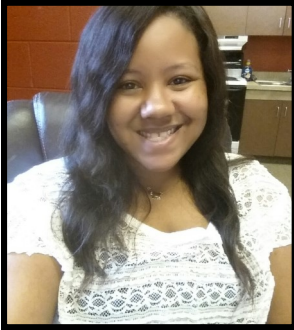
## From the Executive Director

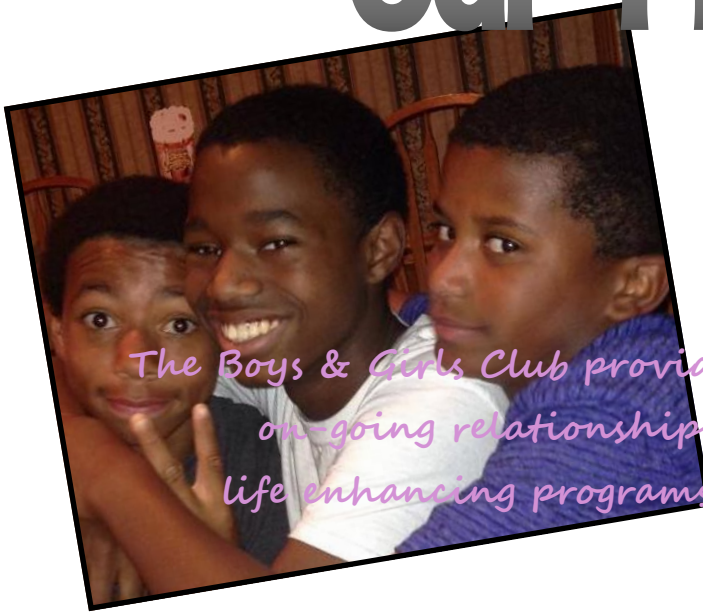

## *Programs are offered in five core areas:*

**Character & Leadership**— Programs that empower youth to support and influence their Club and community and grow as a productive, responsible citizen (Youth of the Year, Junior Staff, Passport to Manhood, SMART Girls, mentoring programs).

**Education & Career Development**— Programs that enable youth to become proficient in basic educational disciplines, apply learning to everyday situations, and embrace technology to achieve success in a career (Power Hour, CLUB Service, Project Learn, LIFT, Money Matters, fun & educational summer day camps).

**Health & Life Skills**— Programs that develop young people's capacity to engage in positive behaviors that nurture their own wellbeing, set personal goals and live successfully (SMART Moves, Kid's Café, Healthy Habits, Triple Play, grief and bereavement programs and activities).

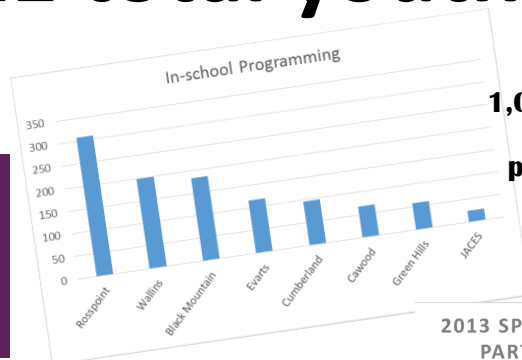

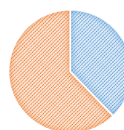

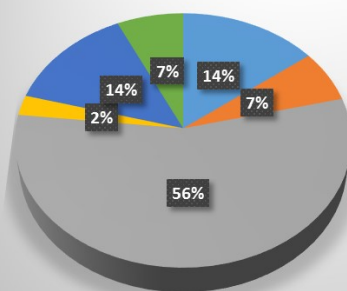

# Nourishing Children's Bodies and Minds

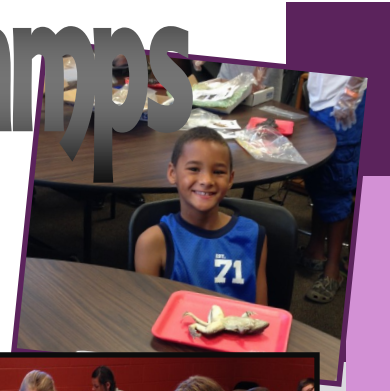
This year, the Club began participating in the at-risk feeding program, a program of the USDA. Immediately afterschool, all Club members receive a fun and nutritious snack. Each evening, Club members receive a warm, healthy evening meal. We are very excited to offer this opportunity to our youth. Many of our children are fed a school breakfast and lunch (which is sometimes as early as 10am) and they may not eat again until the next day. Through this partnership with the Child & Adult Care Food Program, we are trying to combat childhood hunger in our area.
