About the presenters:

Denise Luscombe is a Paediatric Physiotherapist who has worked in the field of paediatrics, disability and early childhood intervention (ECI) for nearly 30 years. She is currently National President of Early Childhood Intervention Australia and Chair of the ECIA WA/NT Alliance. Denise has worked with children of all ages (from neonatal intensive care to school age) but mainly in the birth to 6 years age group. She is currently employed as a Consultant Physiotherapist at Disability Services Commission, Perth. Denise has been the recipient of an Honorary Ray Young Scholarship and was an inaugural recipient of a Count Me In Scholarship which has enabled her to travel to the US, Canada and UK to investigate best practice in ECI. Areas of interest include the practical application of family-centred practice, working with families using coaching, using family and child's strengths and interests, responsive teaching, authentic assessment, learning in context (routine based interviewing, observation and intervention), inclusion and inclusive practice, collaborative teamwork and key worker models of service delivery, and evidence-based discipline practices.

Maxine Drake is an advocate and brings to this session her understanding of the issues for families, drawn from situations of supporting negotiation for services in a range of settings including health, disability services and education.
